
United States relief efforts in Pakistan Photo summary of operations to date

USAID volunteers load earthquake relief supplies on to trucks to reach earthquake victims in remote and often inaccessible areas. To date, USAID has provided more than \$39 million in humanitarian assistance. USAID has provided shelter materials for 67,500 people, blankets for 15,000 people, water containers for 15,000 families, medical supplies to last 3 months for 100,000 people, water storage capacity for 8 communities, and water treatment units supplying safe drinking water for 20,000 people per day.
