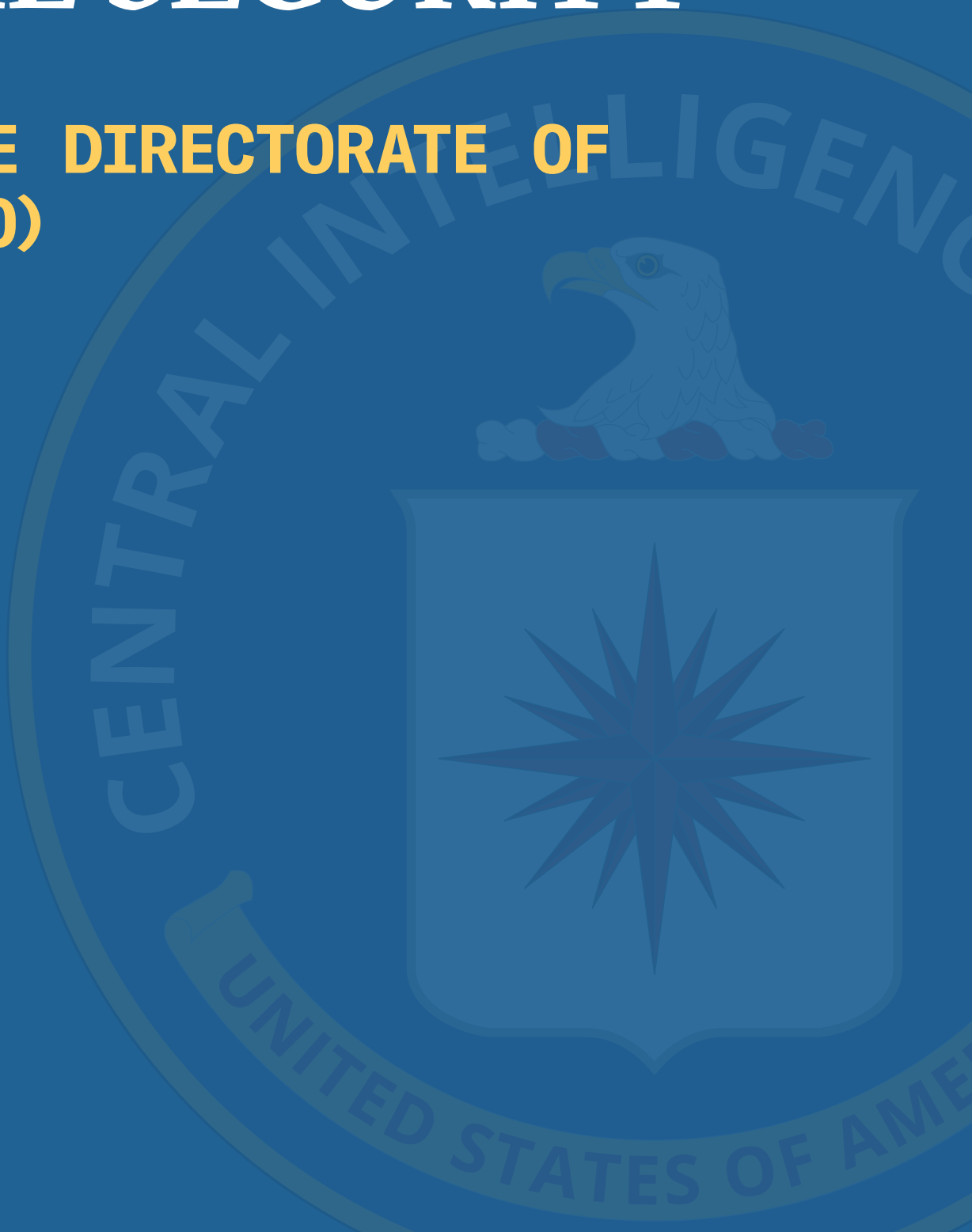

CASE OFFICER

DESCRIPTION:
Build strong personal relationships to develop and recruit sources to obtain high-value foreign intelligence.

SKILLSET:
Use your problem-solving skills in fast-paced, ambiguous situations to collect foreign intelligence and conduct clandestine operations worldwide.



STAFF OPERATIONS OFFICER

DESCRIPTION:
Strategize and oversee foreign intelligence operations and covert action programs, ensuring every mission is a success.

SKILLSET:
Balance your program management expertise with your interest in international affairs and your networking skills to drive operations through informed risk-taking, critical thinking, and creative problem solving.



PARAMILITARY OFFICER

DESCRIPTION:
Apply your military leadership expertise from your experience in Combat Arms and/or Special Operations Forces to conduct intelligence activities in challenging environments.

SKILLSET:
Lead small teams and provide agile operational and technical solutions in support of mission requirements.



COLLECTION MANAGEMENT OFFICER

DESCRIPTION:
Ensure intelligence is delivered with clarity and accuracy while protecting sources and methods.

SKILLSET:
Apply your critical-thinking, attention to detail, and communication skills to evaluate the foreign intelligence collected to safeguard our Nation.



TARGETING OFFICER

DESCRIPTION:
Craft innovative strategies for intelligence gathering. Drive complex operations that involve the collection of foreign intelligence through target analysis and strategic assessment.

SKILLSET:
Employ your inquisitive nature, analytic mindset, and communication skills to share critical information to complete the intelligence puzzle.



LANGUAGE OFFICER

DESCRIPTION:
Use your fluency to unlock the meaning behind crucial intelligence and build strong relationships.

SKILLSET:
Apply your cultural awareness to add context to the Nation's highest priority foreign intelligence.

READY FOR NEXT STEPS?

Hiring Requirements for Directorate of Operations (DO) Positions Include:

- Be a U.S. citizen (including dual or naturalized)
- Be at least 18 years of age
- Be willing to relocate to the Washington, DC area
- Be able to complete security and medical evaluations
- Minimum of a Bachelor's degree
