MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR OF CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE:

HR70-14

For several years the Harold Pratt House (Publishers of "Foreign Affairs") has sponsored the "Council on Foreign Relations"-- a group of individuals highly placed in the political and diplomatic field. One of the vice presidents of this council is [redacted]

The Council is forming a new discussion group for the purpose of occasional discussions of Soviet policy. They have invited [redacted] to sit as a member.

There are obvious advantages and disadvantages to an employee of CIG being a member of such a group. It is suggested that you discuss this with [redacted] on Thursday, 19 Decemoer, in New York.
