Director's Meeting

Monday, 19 June 1951

The Director said that General Bolling had called him concerning the constant leak of gasoline from [redacted]. The Director said that Mr. Dulles should do something about this.

The Director discussed the acceptance of Gordon Gray and asked the White House to hold up on any press release until the matter had been clarified. He said that he had read the report on WSB and it was inclined toward the Magruder concept.

Mr. Jackson reported that he had a visit from Vladimir Behr of Newport, Rhode Island, who had seen McGrath and then Souers on psychological warfare. Mr. Jackson told Mr. Behr that he was clawing at the wrong tree.

Mr. Dulles pointed out that the [redacted] arms shipments were now public.

Mr. Dulles reported a meeting with General Ackerman and Mr. Armstrong at which the Air Force suggested that we stop our efforts to get MIG 15's because the Czechs wouldn't give back our F-84's. Mr. Dulles said that he had convinced General Ackerman that this was not a sound proposal and that we would continue to get MIG 15's.

Mr. Dulles said that he would proceed to implement the first phase of Mr. Jackson's report on his staff.

There was discussion of security. Mr. Jackson proposed a survey of our security setup by an impartial outsider. It was agreed that some effort should be made to get more imagination into our security efforts.
