Director's Meeting

Friday, 29 June 1951

The Director asked what was the criticism of our paper on trade in Malaya and said that in reporting items for the log O/RR HR70-14 should indicate such matters.

The Director said that a request should be made for the JCS comment on our recommendations to Ridgeway. (Joe: will you follow up on this.)

Mr. Jackson reported that he had seen [REDACTED] in New York and thought that he could recruit him.

The Director said that he would like to see [REDACTED] before he left to thank him for his service. (Joe: its yours.)

Mr. Dulles commented on the briefing of VIPs and said that his brother had been very unimpressed with the calibre of the people present. It was agreed that it would be preferable to set up a small interrogating unit and to do away with the mass presentations. (I talked to [REDACTED] about this and they are preparing a new format. Suggest you check with them on this and make sure they follow through. Also showed Dulles a list of those present at his brother's meeting.)

Mr. Dulles reported that Houghton and Mifflin wanted to buy Willoughby's spy story. The Director said that a plane should be sent for Willoughby and that he should be brought to Washington and sold on going to [REDACTED] for the agency.

Mr. Dulles said that O/SO wanted to send [REDACTED] to [REDACTED]. The Director said that this couldn't be done because [REDACTED] was going to teach languages. It was agreed that [REDACTED] could go to Indo China for three months.
