Mr. Jackson reported that [redacted] seemed very upset by the fact that he had to clear all projects for \$5,000 and up with CIA. Mr. Wisner stated that it was more a question of physical procurement than it was of projects. There was considerable discussion and the DCI finally stated that he wants it worked out so that they can procure as much as possible on a reasonable basis. Mr. Wisner has the matter under study. Mr. Wisner reported that a letter had been received from BBC giving [redacted] full marks for Radio Free Europe.

Mr. Wisner spoke again about Admiral Stevens' resignation and left a list of nine prospective candidates with the DCI.

Mr. Wisner again mentioned Congressman Sparkman's talk on guerillas in China. The DCI said that Mr. Dulles would probably speak to him.

The DCI asked about [redacted] Mr. Wisner has heard nothing new but will check.

[redacted] reported that in anticipation of increased requirements due to the agreement on [redacted] OSO has already started planning.

The DCI stated that from now on he will prefer to have the IAC meetings at 10:30.
