DAILY STAFF MEETING

Wednesday, 12 September 1951

Colonel Taylor raised the question of distribution of JCS papers received in the Agency. [redacted] stated that the DCI had agreed with the Joint Chiefs that certain of these papers should be delivered direct to [redacted] who in turn would bring those papers which in his opinion should be brought, to the attention of the Director. This arrangement also includes JCS cables, particularly dealing with our peace negotiations now being carried on at Kaesong. In this connection, Mr. Reber noted that a representative of ONE has been authorized to visit the Joint Intelligence Group from time to time in order to read such JIC papers that might be of interest to CIA.

[redacted] reported that he had discussed with Colonel Edwards the security aspects of the DCI's forthcoming trip and requested that those present discuss the trip only on a need-to-know basis.

[redacted] also reported that he had received a call from Deke DeLoach (FBI Liaison Officer to CIA) regarding the meeting between the DCI and Mr. Hoover. Mr. DeLoach was informed that it was believed that this meeting would take place some time after the Director's return from Europe. Mr. Becker noted that General Smith has a proposed agenda of items the various offices of the Agency wish him to discuss with Mr. Hoover.

Mr. Becker stated that the DCI had indicated that we should not furnish John Scali any [redacted] Colonel Hansen noted that he had discussed this matter at some length with Messrs. Dulles and Jackson, and that Mr. Dulles stated that: (a) He did not believe that the Director had all the facts in this case; and (b) he would discuss it again with the DCI.

Colonel Hansen briefly discussed the Director's reaction to the revision of NSC 68, and indicated that General Smith desired to "stick with specifics" and also to use the proposed generalized comments. This paper has now been redrafted and is ready for circulation to the IAC. It may possibly come up for discussion at tomorrow's IAC meeting if there is one held.
