

Mr. Larocque briefly discussed the results of a meeting between CIA and State representatives,



Colonel Hansen reported that Professor Dunham of Yale had asked for guidance from Sherman Kent concerning a request received by the University from the American Society of Newspaper Editors for copies of the "Yale Study", to be used by the Society for discussion at an early meeting. Professor Dunham was advised to inform these people that this Study was produced under contract to the Government, had been turned over to it, and that Yale had no control over further dissemination of the Study in question. Professor Dunham indicated that this answer was satisfactory to him and the University.

Mr. Reber reported that:

- (a) He had recently requested through G-2 two liaison contacts with G-4 and had had no trouble in getting them. He proposes to follow this procedure in future cases until such time as more satisfactory arrangements can be made.
- (b) G-2, during a five-month period, received approximately 25,000 documents of all kinds from CIA. In their evaluation procedure, 617 had been marked for central filing. He pointed out, however, that

the low number of documents sent to G-2 central files is not an indication that a greater number of these documents were of no value since a number of them were being retained in the files of individual analysts. This statement led to the discussion of the need for a central reading panel composed of representatives of the IAC agencies to screen our disseminations and therefore not to burden the files of the several intelligence agencies with material which will be of little or no benefit. Mr. Reber also noted that Dr. Millikan was working with Dr. Andrews on the problem of strengthening our own Library facilities in order to discontinue the practice of CIA analysts reading and amassing great files of intelligence material.

Mr. Harvey reported that: 1

- (a) The Budget for PSB for the next fiscal year would be [redacted] of which we are responsible for one-third.
- (b) The Bureau of the Budget had approved CIA furnishing for PSB slots [redacted]
