

- a. Mr. Pforzheimer discussed yesterday the [] case with [] and Senator McCarran. At the present time they have agreed to hold [] appearance before the McCarran Committee in abeyance. He also noted Senator McCarran was "embarrassed" by the fact that the Committee had called [] to testify, since the Senator, after being informed of the work [] was doing for us, recalled that he had agreed some time ago not to call []. In connection with this dilemma, Colonel Hansen met with [] who indicated that in his opinion the individual concerned would be on strong ground provided if and when [] was called to testify his testimony would parallel that of the "accused".
- b. Senator Bridges and the Committee Staff have intimated that we might possibly get [] for the construction of our building. However, this is only from the Senate side and still has to be considered by the House. He also noted that it may be necessary for the DCI to talk with Congressman Taber and Congressman Mahon.
- c. He had done some preliminary work on the CIA Progress Report for the President and the NSC and believed the next step should be to discuss this at an early AD's meeting. Mr. Larocque stated he would mention this to the DCI.

[] stated that at an early IAC Meeting Mr. Kirkpatrick wished to brief the members in executive session on priorities produced by the Inter-Agency Priorities Committee. Mr. Kirkpatrick also intends to bring out the fact that the same people from the Service intelligence agencies do not attend each meeting.
