DIRECTOR'S MEETING

Monday, 28 January 1952

Mr. Dulles:

b. Stated that a cable had been received from Mr. Kirkpatrick inquiring whether or not the Director had given any special instructions to [redacted] prior to his departure. The Director briefly reviewed his instructions to [redacted] after which Mr. Dulles recalled that Messrs. Kirkpatrick and Johnson had been present at the time these instructions were discussed with [redacted]

c. Left with the Director General Merrill's paper, "Report on CIA Operations". Note--Later the DCI asked that this report be held until [redacted] return.

Mr. Wisner:

a. Referred to the recent item in the log concerning G-2 EUCOM support for [redacted]. The DCI stated that: (1) he would call Gen. Bolling on this; (2) Mr. Wisner should request a report from Gen. Truscott; (3) Gen. Truscott could, in all probability, straighten this matter out with Gen. Handy.

b. Discussed the recent cable [redacted] concerning [redacted] wish to combine [redacted]. The Director stated that he had discussed this matter with the President on 25 January and there was no objection to our proceeding along the lines indicated in the above referred to message. Mr. Dulles noted that he was keeping State informed of our progress in this matter.

c. Noted that George Kennan was in town and would like to see the Director. The DCI indicated his approval and stated he would get in touch with Mr. Kennan through Mr. Webb's office.

The Director commented on the information contained in the State cable pertaining to [redacted] proposed reduction in France's defense budget and contributions to NATO.
