
Director's Meeting

Mr. Wisner:

a. Noted that word had been received of the defection of a Soviet sergeant and a Polish official, the latter defecting to Radio Free Europe.

b. Referred to the exchange of correspondence between Headquarters and General Barbour concerning the return of [ ] and noted that [ ] had finally resigned rather than return. However, there was a possibility that he might turn up as an actual employee of State on the staff of Ambassador Duke in El Salvador.

c. Noted that "the agreed activities paper" had bogged down and asked the Director if he would give it a "push" at the next IAC Meeting. The Director stated that the only problem he was aware of in this regard was Berlin coordination and Mr. Kirkpatrick was presently there to settle this matter with General Truscott. Mr. Wisner stated that it was his understanding that there were other areas involved, and after some discussion, Mr. Becker undertook to look into this matter. *S-5-27-52*  
*Done - Mr. Becker has made a report on this to DCI.*

d. Noted that the Director might receive a call from Mr. Harriman concerning a project of [ ]

it was determined that Mr. Dulles had approved this project about two weeks ago.

e. Noted that we had completed with State all of our last-minute pre-election actions in regard [redacted] Mr. Wisner also noted that the situation still looks somewhat ominous.

Mr. Becker:

a. Referred to General Twining's remarks at the dinner for General Koenig on the 21st concerning Air Force assistance in a certain area and undertook to follow through on this with the IAC.

b. Read a portion of an FBIS intercept from the German East Zone outlining forthcoming reaction of the East Zone Government
