Mr. Wisner:

b. Showed the Director a cable from [REDACTED] reporting on questions asked of him by Sen. Hendrickson of the McCarran Subcommittee. Mr. Wisner noted that [REDACTED] had side stepped certain of these but had been embarrassed by their private nature. The Director dictated a message to the field, to be sent [REDACTED] saying in effect that Senior Representatives should firmly but courteously decline to answer questions which in their view went beyond the proper concern of the Subcommittee or dealt with matters which they did not wish to discuss, and suggest that these matters be taken up with the Director in Washington.

Col. White

Reported on the security violation by [redacted] indicated that the situation is well in hand and that the man in question, who is now in the US, is under 24 hour surveillance by I&S. The Director instructed Col. White to bring the FBI in on the case.

Mr. Becker:

Reported that in the view of [redacted] the JCS contribution to the estimate of Soviet capability to injure the US is inadequate and that Gen. Samford would seek a discussion with the DCI on the subject. The Director said that his lack of knowledge on details would make such a discussion pointless and that Mr. Becker should carry on. The Director asked Mr. Becker to draft a letter to the Executive Secretary of the NSC requesting an extension of time. S-11 Aug 52 Mr. desired by DCI being held up at request of [redacted] who feels he can get a report in on time. Mr. Becker informs me that DCI knows what's going on & that he & Mr. Becker will inform AWF when something definite develops. Done.
