1. In summer 1954, officers from East Germany were studying in Soviet military academies. This has been a normal practice for officers from the other People's Democracies in Europe.
2. These (foreign) student officers generally study in special groups apart from the Soviet officers, but they share dormitory and library facilities with them.
3. Source did not know how many foreign student officers were enrolled in any one military academy, but he thought that the Frunze Academy probably had the largest enrollment of all. He estimated that currently more than 50 foreign student officers were probably enrolled in the Frunze Academy.
