

On the afternoon of August 2nd, Mr. Corcoran phoned me stating he was now prepared and anxious to go ahead with settling the accounts between CAT Incorporated and Civil Air Transport, Incorporated and that he would like to have the \$23,000 due CATT. He stated Mr. Brennan is currently in New York, would be in Washington within a few days and that from their side they wanted to go ahead immediately. I advised him we would need to have the assistance of our auditor, Mr. Ed Taylor, and any new information which Mr. Taylor has developed during his current trip to the Far East. Mr. Corcoran was advised that Mr. Taylor would return to the U.S. later this month and that we would not be prepared to talk before that time.

Mr. Corcoran stated further that since the Senate and House were adjourned, he now desired to go ahead with matters concerning the First Refusal held by Messrs. Willauer and Brennan. I asked how this subject came up at this time and was told that we had approached him in connection with our determinations as to whether or not it would be feasible and desirable to sell from one to four of our C-46 fleet. During the brief and pleasant conversation which followed, he stated that he now had plenty of time to go to court on this matter if such action was found necessary.

Mr. Corcoran also stated that he had been advised Lew Burrige and wife were in the U.S. and asked me to let him know of Mr. Burrige's whereabouts since he was quite anxious to be in touch with him.
