

PREFACE

This report is one in a series on Soviet Ground Force and logistic installations being prepared for a DIA/CIA Panel. The series is being coordinated, published and disseminated by NPIC. The photographic analysis is being performed by the NPIC Photographic Analysis Group, the CIA Photographic Intelligence Division (NPIC), and the Production Center 1P1c (DIA). The photographic analysis for this particular report was performed by the NPIC Photographic Analysis Group.

In the interest of uniformity, the titles and letter designators for the facilities observed at these installations are identical with those appearing in the project requirement. When a specific facility is not observed both its title and letter designator are omitted in the report.

Titles and letter designators for the various facilities are as follows: (A) railroad service, (B) road service, (C) landing strips, (D) administrative and troop housing areas, (E) storage areas, (F) ammunition storage areas, (G) POL storage areas, (H) other buildings and facilities, (J) equipment storage/maintenance areas, (K) athletic fields, (L) small arms firing ranges, (M) driver training areas, (N) tank/assault gun firing ranges, (P) flat trajectory firing ranges, (Q) artillery emplacements (batteries), (R) infantry or combined arms field training area or courses, (S) special training facilities, (T) unidentified facilities or tracking activity.




FIGURE 1. LOCATION OF DNEPROPETROVSK ARMY BARRACKS CENTRAL.

SUMMARY




FIGURE 3. DNEPROPETROVSK ARMY BARRACKS CENTRAL. Sketch compiled from NPIC J-5204 (11/64) June 1964.

Dnepropetrovsk Army Barracks Central is located in the western section of Dnepropetrovsk (Figure 1) and covers approximately 50 acres. It contains 3 administration buildings, 4 barracks, 14 storage buildings, 6 support buildings, 3 vehicle maintenance buildings, 5 vehicle storage sheds, and a vehicle park (Figures 2 and 3).

This installation was covered by February

1960 TALENT photography and 6 KEYHOLE Missions between April 1962 and June 1964. The only significant change in the facilities was the removal of one storage building between February 1960 and April 1962. A high level of activity was observed throughout the period covered.

DESCRIPTION OF INSTALLATION

Road Service

The installation has access to city streets.

Administrative and Troop Housing Areas

Area D1 contains 1 administration building, 3 barracks, and 2 storage buildings.

Area D2 contains 1 administration building.

Area D3 contains 1 administration building, 1 barracks, and 1 storage building.

General Storage Areas

Area E1 contains 5 storage buildings and 3 support buildings. One storage building was removed from this area between February 1960 and April 1962.

Area E2 contains 5 storage buildings.

Equipment Storage/Maintenance Areas

Area J1 contains 2 vehicle maintenance buildings measuring 175 by 50 feet and 160 by 55 feet, 2 vehicle storage sheds measuring 175 by 30 feet and 190 by 30 feet, and 2 support buildings.

Area J2 contains a 180- by 45-foot vehicle maintenance building, 3 vehicle storage sheds measuring 150 by 30 feet, 225 by 30 feet, and 300 by 40 feet, a storage building, and a support building.

Area J3 is a 300- by 230-foot vehicle park. Two rows of probable vehicles were observed in the park in June 1964.


