


SOVIET MILITARY ORDER OF BATTLE BAL TIC MD





PREFACE

This report is one in a series on Soviet Ground Force and Logistic installations being prepared for a DIA/CIA Panel. The series is being coordinated, published and disseminated by NPIC. The photographic analysis is being performed by the NPIC Photographic Analysis Group, the CIA Photographic Intelligence Division (NPIC), and the Production Center 1P1a (DIA). The photographic analysis for this particular report was performed by the Production Center 1P1a.

In the interest of uniformity, the titles and letter designators for the facilities observed at these installations are identical with those appearing in the project requirement. When a specific facility is not observed both its title and letter designator are omitted in the report.

Titles and letter designators for the various facilities are as follows: (A) railroad service, (B) road service, (C) landing strips, (D) administrative and troop housing areas, (E) storage areas, (F) ammunition storage areas, (G) POL storage areas, (H) other buildings and facilities, (J) equipment storage/maintenance areas, (K) athletic fields, (L) small arms firing ranges, (M) driver training areas, (N) tank/assault gun firing ranges, (P) flat trajectory firing ranges, (Q) artillery emplacements (batteries), (R) infantry or combined arms field training areas or courses, (S) special training facilities, (T) unidentified facilities or tracking activity.




FIGURE 1. LOCATION OF GUSEV MILITARY BARRACKS NORTHEAST.

SUMMARY

Gusev Military Barracks Northeast is located at the northeastern edge of Gusev and is within 4 kilometers (km) of Gusev Military Barracks North and Gusev Army Barracks Rominte River South (Figure 1).






FIGURE 3. GUSEV MILITARY BARRACKS NORTHEAST. Sketch compiled from [] June 1964.

This barracks installation covers 130 acres and contains 1 probable barracks/administration building, 14 barracks, 12 general storage buildings, 7 vehicle maintenance/storage buildings,

and a motor park with probable tanks/SP guns and vehicles. Four firing ranges and a driver-training course with 1 building are at the northern end of the camp (Figures 2 and 3).

This area was covered on interpretable photography from 8 KEYHOLE missions between December 1961 and September 1964. A comparative analysis reveals no significant change in buildings or activity.

DESCRIPTION OF INSTALLATION

Railroad Service

A marshalling yard and transloading point are located 1 km south on the main rail line between Chernyakhovsk and Chernyshevskoye.

Road Service

This installation has ready access to good secondary roads running north and south and to a primary road running east and west.

Administration and Troop Housing Areas

Area D1 contains 1 probable barracks/administration building and 5 single-story barracks.

Area D2 contains 7 multistory barracks and 2 single-story barracks.

General Storage Areas

Area E1 contains 6 probable sheds.

Area E2 contains 6 probable sheds.

Equipment Storage/Maintenance Areas

Area J1 contains 4 vehicle storage and maintenance buildings, each 200 by 30 feet, and 3 vehicle storage buildings, each 250 by 50 feet.

Area J2 contains a motor park, 500 by 300 feet, with 56 canvas-covered probable tanks/SP guns and 6 unidentified canvas-covered vehicles.

Athletic Field

Area K is an athletic field.

Small-Arms Firing Ranges

Area L1 contains 3 ranges each 500 by 35 feet.

Area L2 contains 1 range 300 by 35 feet.

Driver-Training Area

Area M contains a figure-8 driver-training course and a small building.
