



PREFACE

This report is one in a series on Soviet Ground Force and Logistic installations being prepared for a DIA/CIA Panel. The series is being coordinated, published and disseminated by NPIC. The photographic analysis is being performed by the NPIC Photographic Analysis Group, the CIA Photographic Intelligence Division (NPIC), and the Production Center 1P1a (DIA). The photographic analysis for this particular report was performed by the Production Center 1P1a.

In the interest of uniformity, the titles and letter designators for the facilities observed at these installations are identical with those appearing in the project requirement. When a specific facility is not observed both its title and letter designator are omitted in the report.

Titles and letter designators for the various facilities are as follows: (A) railroad service, (B) road service, (C) landing strips, (D) administrative and troop housing areas, (E) storage areas, (F) ammunition storage areas, (G) POL storage areas, (H) other buildings and facilities, (J) equipment storage/maintenance areas, (K) athletic fields, (L) small arms firing ranges, (M) driver training areas, (N) tank/assault gun firing ranges, (P) flat trajectory firing ranges, (Q) artillery emplacements (batteries), (R) infantry or combined arms field training areas or courses, (S) special training facilities, (T) unidentified facilities or tracking activity.





FIGURE 1. LOCATION OF TALLINN ARMY BARRACKS.

SUMMARY

The Tallinn Army Barracks is located in the southern part of Tallinn, approximately 290 kilometers (km) north of Riga and 310 km west-southwest of Leningrad (Figure 1).

This installation covers approximately 660 acres and contains 92 buildings: 2 administration buildings, 2 barracks/administration buildings, 24 barracks, 30 storage buildings, 14 equipment storage/maintenance buildings, and






FIGURE 3. TALLINN ARMY BARRACKS. Sketch compiled from [] July 1964.

20 support buildings. Other facilities include 2 housing areas, an athletic field, and 2 driver-training areas (Figures 2 and 3).

This installation is covered on 6 KEYHOLE missions from September 1961 to August 1964. Possible recent changes include the construction of a barracks and the removal of 2 or more support buildings.

DESCRIPTION OF INSTALLATION

Railroad Service

The rail line between Tallinn and Nomme passes along the eastern side of the installation.

Road Service

The installation is served by city streets.

Aircraft Landing Strips

The Tallinn/Ulemiste Airfield is approximately 4 km east and the Tallinn/Lasnamae Airfield is approximately 7 km northeast.

Administration and Troop Housing Areas

Area D1 contains 2 large multistory barracks/administration buildings, 5 multistory barracks, 9 other barracks, 5 support buildings, and a housing area.

Area D2 contains a C-shaped multistory administration building, 10 multistory barracks, and 9 support buildings.

Area D3 is a housing area with an administration building.

General Storage Areas

Area E1 contains 18 storage buildings and 5 support buildings.

Area E2 contains 12 storage buildings and a support building.

POL Storage Areas

Three small POL areas are in the vicinity of Tallinn.

Equipment Storage/Maintenance Areas

Area J1 contains 6 storage/maintenance buildings: one 390 by 100 feet, one 220 by 65 feet, one 270 by 65 feet, one 210 by 60 feet, and two 130 by 80 feet.

Area J2 contains 8 storage/maintenance buildings: one 150 by 30-50 feet, three 220 by 65 feet, one 210 by 50 feet, one 190 by 35-50 feet, one 130 by 50 feet, and one 160 by 30 feet with wings 40 by 40 feet.

Athletic Field

Area K is an oval athletic field.

Driver-Training Areas

Area M1 is a driver-training area for wheeled vehicles.

Area M2 is a driver-training area for wheeled vehicles and possibly tracked vehicles.
