

The photographic analysis for this particular report was performed by the NPIC Photographic Analysis Group.

In the interest of uniformity, the titles and letter designators for the facilities observed at these installations are identical with those appearing in the project requirement. When a specific facility is not observed both its title and letter designator are omitted in the report.

Titles and letter designators for the various facilities are as follows: (A) railroad service, (B) road service, (C) landing strips, (D) administrative and troop housing areas, (E) storage areas, (F) ammunition storage areas, (G) POL storage areas, (H) other buildings and facilities, (J) equipment storage/maintenance areas, (K) athletic fields, (L) small arms firing ranges, (M) driver training areas, (N) tank/assault gun firing ranges, (P) flat trajectory firing ranges, (Q) artillery emplacements (batteries), (R) infantry or combined arms field training area or courses, (S) special training facilities, (T) unidentified facilities or tracking activity.




FIGURE 1. LOCATION OF SELECTED MILITARY INSTALLATIONS, GORKIY.

SUMMARY

Two military installations are located within the walls of the Gorkiy Kremlin. Gorkiy Headquarters Barracks and School Kremlin [redacted] AL No 8) is located in the southern part of the Kremlin, and an adjoining associated barracks area (AL No 4) is located in the northern section (Figure 1). The current military significance of these installations is undetermined.





FIGURE 3. SELECTED MILITARY INSTALLATIONS, GORKIY. Sketch compiled from [redacted] June 1964.

Gorkiy Headquarters Barracks and School Kremlin covers approximately 24 acres and contains 1 classroom building, 1 administration

building, 3 barracks, 1 storage/maintenance building, and 11 support buildings. The associated barracks area covers approximately 20 acres and contains 1 administration building, 3 barracks, and 1 support building (Figures 2 and 3).

The installations were covered on February 1960 TALENT photography and 13 KEYHOLE missions between December 1961 and January 1965. There has been no change at either installation; a light level of activity is evident on all coverage.

DESCRIPTION OF INSTALLATIONS

Road Service

The installations are served by city streets.

Administration and Troop Housing Areas

Area D1, Gorkiy Headquarters Barracks and School Kremlin, contains 1 multistory classroom building, 1 multistory U-shaped administration building, 2 U-shaped multistory barracks, 1 multistory barracks, and 10 support buildings. The area is secured on 2 sides by a wall and on the 2 other sides by a fence.

Area D2 contains 1 multistory administra-

tion building, 1 T-shaped multistory barracks, 2 multistory barracks, and 1 support building.

POL Storage Areas

Ninety large storage tanks and 5 petroleum reservoirs are located at 56-21N 043-54E. Nine small POL tanks are located at 56-19N 043-55E. Seven large POL tanks are located at 56-17N 043-58E.

Other Buildings

Area H contains 1 large streetcar storage/maintenance building and 1 support building.
