

SUMMARY:

This report is a translation from Russian of a Soviet General Staff Document for the Polish General Staff, classified TOP SECRET and entitled Operational Task for the Command-Staff Exercise "ZAPAD [West]-77". This document provides the general background scenario on 31 May 1977 for the exercise and the specific status and compositions of the participants in the exercise under Polish command and of the "Westerners". Five attachments describe: 1) Coordinated Measures Supporting the Movement of the [Soviet] Fourth and Fifth Fronts through Polish Territory; 2) The Combat Composition of the [Polish] First Front; 3) Manning and Equipment Status of the Combat Complement of the Troops of the First Front; 4) Composition of Medical Facilities, Fuel Supplies, and Rolling Stock Allocated to Allied Troops; and 5) Combat Composition of the Armed Forces of the "Westerners". NOTE: In Attachment 5, question marks in place of unit designations and numbers of aircraft or ships appear where they were used in the original document.



I

GENERAL SITUATION

1. In early 1977, the "Westerners" began openly to pursue a course of aggravating relations with the Warsaw Pact countries. The governments of the NATO countries have stepped up diplomatic and military pressure on the non-aligned countries for the purpose of having them cease military-political cooperation with the USSR.


The West German leadership has officially announced that West Berlin is an integral part of the Federal Republic of Germany and is making demands for the reunification of Germany within its prewar borders.

Military preparations have increased markedly in the countries of the North Atlantic bloc. In 1976, the arms industry of the Western countries, particularly the Federal Republic of Germany, increased the production of combat equipment and armament. At the same time, there was an increase in the shipments of material-technical supplies and certain types of modern weapons from the US, Great Britain, and Canada to West Germany, Belgium, and the Netherlands.

In March, at a special extraordinary session of the NATO Council, held at the heads of state level, the bloc countries set down the general line in the event of war in Europe and also coordinated practical measures for increasing the combat readiness of the armed forces.

At the end of April, the Command of the NATO Allied Armed Forces announced that ground, air, and naval force maneuvers would be held in early June 1977 in Europe and the Atlantic under the code name SUMMER ADVANCE. France and Spain also announced the conduct of large-scale national exercises on their territory.

The NATO Allied Naval Forces, under the guise of the preparation for combined maneuvers, are deploying forces to combat mission areas. The number of nuclear missile submarines on patrol in the North Atlantic has been increased from 13 to 21; and in the Norwegian Sea, from two to four. Two carrier multipurpose groups of the US Navy have been observed in the Central Atlantic and one in the North Atlantic. The British strike carrier Ark Royal has been observed in PLYMOUTH.

A considerable increase in military preparations is being noted in China. Appearing in the propaganda statements of the Chinese leaders are territorial claims against the Soviet Union and accusations of aggression.

2. The "Easterners", having ascertained the threatening nature of the military preparations of the "Westerners", are secretly carrying out measures to bring their armed forces to full combat readiness.

* The Command of the Combined Armed Forces of the Warsaw Pact member states has also announced the forthcoming conduct of large-scale exercises at the beginning of June for the staffs, troops, and naval forces of the allied states on the territory of the Polish People's Republic, the German Democratic Republic, the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic, the Hungarian People's Republic, the western areas of the Soviet Union, and in the Baltic Sea.

SPECIFIC SITUATION AS OF 31 MAY

1. Large units and units of the Polish Armed Forces have been moved into concentration areas and, as of 28 May, are being brought to full combat readiness. As of 2000, 30 May, the First Front has been constituted from the complement of the Polish Armed Forces.

The 12th Air Army is at permanent base airfields and a part of its forces is on combat alert. At each airfield, two fighter crews are being held at Readiness No. 1 (the remaining crews at Readiness No. 2 and Readiness No. 3). Advance parties of the air regiments, komendaturas of the rear units, and subunits of the communications units are located in dispersal airfields, ready to move out to operational airfields.

The front air defense troops have been deployed in siting areas and troop concentration areas, with the observance of camouflage measures. One battalion in the surface-to-air missile brigade and one battery in each surface-to-air missile regiment are kept on combat alert status in Readiness No. 1, with a time period for opening fire of from two to 15 minutes.

The Air Defense Forces of the Polish People's Republic have been brought to full combat readiness, and, in cooperation with the forces and means of the 5th and 14th Separate Armies of the Air Defense Forces of the Soviet Army, and the forces of the German Democratic Republic and the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic, the 12th Air Army, and the air defense of the First Front and the Combined Baltic Fleet, are covering administrative-political and industrial centers, airfields, troops, naval bases, and rear services installations against enemy air strikes. The radiotechnical troops are kept on a scheduled round-the-clock combat alert.

Engineer troop large units and units have been moved to concentration areas and are carrying out engineer support tasks in accordance with the plan of measures for bringing the Polish Armed Forces to full combat readiness.

The Northern Group of Forces has been reorganized into the 23d Army (reserve of the Supreme High Command).

2. The Command of the NATO Allied Armed Forces in the Central European Theater of Military Operations is continuing secret mobilization under the guise of preparing for exercises and is also carrying out large-scale movements and regroupings of troops and naval forces in Central Europe, the Atlantic, and the Baltic straits area. Tactical exercises involving units of the Federal Republic of Germany have been noted in the areas of WITTENBERGE and WOLFSBURG.


In the areas of OSNABRUCK and KASSEL units of Dutch and Belgian troops, respectively, are being concentrated. The unloading of armament and materiel-technical means has been noted in the port of ESBJERG (200 kilometers north of BREMERHAVEN)

Border security has been intensified in the Federal Republic of Germany. As of 20 May, flights of American strategic bombers with nuclear weapons aboard have been noted. In the period 27-28 May there were six to eight tests a day of the control system for the nuclear alert forces and the mobile nuclear warhead storage points. An unscheduled test of the control organs and communications system of the US Armed Forces Europe was held on 28 May.

The NATO Allied Air Forces continue to increase the combat readiness of the air large units and units in Central Europe. Aircraft are being transferred from the US to Europe to the ENSCHEDE and LEEUWARDEN airfields (100 kilometers northeast of AMSTERDAM). Six to nine combat aircraft (of these, two to four delivery aircraft) from each squadron are on combat alert on 15-minute combat readiness.

Aerial reconnaissance is being carried out by aircraft and helicopters along the national boundary of the Federal Republic of Germany with the German Democratic Republic and the Czechoslovak Soviet Republic without violating their airspace.

The air defense forces and means of the "Westerners" have been brought to increased combat readiness. Two batteries from each Hawk and Nike-Hercules surface-to-air guided missile battalion and two to four aircraft from each air defense fighter squadron are on permanent combat alert in five-minute readiness. In addition, four aircraft from each air defense fighter squadron are in 15-minute combat readiness. Tests of the communications between the operations centers of the air defense sectors and the Hawk and Nike-Hercules surface-to-air guided missile battalions are being conducted up to eight times a day. Reconnaissance of air targets is being carried out by permanent ground centers and posts.

3. The troop status of the sides is shown on the charts (attachments).


COMMUNICATIONS SITUATION

The communications system and troops of the General Staff of the Polish Armed Forces have been brought to full combat readiness. From the Command Post of the General Staff of the Polish Armed Forces, via channels of the state network and the General Staff communications network, secure telephone and telegraph and governmental communications have been established with the following:

- the Command Post of the Commander-in-Chief of the Forces in the Western Theater of Military Operations;

- the General Staff of the Czechoslovak People's Army and the Main Staff of the National People's Army of the German Democratic Republic;
- The Command Post of the First Front;
- The Command Post of the Combined Baltic Fleet;
- Supporting Communications Center No. 13 (SLUBICE);
- Central Combined Troop Regrouping Control Posts Nos. 1 and 2;
- Subordinate formations.

The communications system of the road traffic control service has been set up from Central Combined Control Posts Nos. 1 and 2 and is prepared to provide control of the regrouping of allied troops and Polish Armed Forces on the territory of the Polish People's Republic.

The Ministry of Communications of the Republic has issued an order to subordinate organs about supplying state network channels to Soviet Army forces in accordance with the previously coordinated list.


The radio communications of the General Staff of the Polish Armed Forces with subordinate troops are provided for by means of fixed radio centers.

Front radioelectronic warfare units, in cooperation with ~~OO~~NAZ units, are searching for and monitoring the operation of the radioelectronic means of the Northern Army Group, the Central Army Group, and the aircraft of the 2d and 4th Allied Tactical Air Forces. For the purpose of radio jamming, the cooperation of radioelectronic warfare units of the First, Second, and Third Fronts and of the Combined Baltic Fleet is being organized. Radio and radiotechnic monitoring subunits and units are continuously monitoring the utilization of our own radioelectronic means.

REAR SERVICES SITUATION

The rear services of the Polish Armed Forces are conducting measures to complete the mobilization expansion of rear services large units and units of the center and of the operational formations of the branches of the armed forces.

From the fixed bases and depots, materiel is being dispersed and issued to the troops, and supplies are being moved to the deployment areas of front and army field bases. The preparation of areas for the mass distribution of supplies to the allied troops is continuing at the fuel reserve depots of the Combined Command.

Mobilization measures are being carried out on the country's railroads and highways. Up to 80 percent of the railroad rolling stock is being used in accordance with the plan of the General Staff of the Polish Armed Forces. Technical coverage forces are being deployed at the installations to be covered. Seven of the 13 temporary transshipment areas have been prepared for deployment. Border transshipment areas have been prepared and are at the disposal of the Commander-in-Chief of the Forces in the Western Theater of Military Operations.


The manning of the medical facilities that have been assigned to the front and that are to be allocated to the allied troops is being completed.

The composition of the medical facilities, the fuel reserves, and the rolling stock to be allocated to the allied troops are indicated in Attachment No. 4.


ADDITIONAL DATA ABOUT THE ENEMY

It has been established by all types of reconnaissance that:

- preparations are being made in the cities of HAMM and COBLENZ to call up second category reserve soldiers and officers;
- a group of officers arrived at the mobile control post of the Central Army Group at 1600, 30 May;
- security has been strengthened for the nuclear warhead depots in the areas of BAD DRIBURG (15 kilometers east of PADERBORN), HUSUM (40 kilometers southwest of FLENSBURG), LUNEBURG, CELLE, and for the airfields at BREMEN and KASSEL;
- groups of Dutch Air Force officers have been observed at the airfields in BREMEN and UTERSEN (20 kilometers northwest of HAMBURG);
- a ferry crossing is being prepared on the Elbe River in an area 40 kilometers north of MAGDEBURG;
- the bridge across the Elbe River in the area of DESSAU (40 kilometers north of LEIPZIG) is under increased security;
- in the border areas of the Federal Republic of Germany, more than 40 new radars of the AN/MPQ-35, 50, and AN/TPS-43 types have been detected;

- in the areas of Plymouth and Hull, up to 40 British Navy ships and transports being loaded with combat equipment have been observed;

- flights of Belgian and Dutch Air Force combat aircraft, with landings at airfields of the Federal Republic of Germany, have increased;

- mines are being loaded aboard ships in the ports of FLENSBURG and KIEL;

- At 1600, 30 May a US Navy convoy was seen (up to 60 ships and transports located 780 miles west of NANTES);

- patients are being transferred to civilian medical facilities from the military hospitals of the Federal Republic of Germany 1st Army Corps and the Belgian 1st Army Corps;

- An increase in the transmission of ciphered and encoded messages in communications traffic has been observed;

- in May, six American LASP and SAMOS-M artificial earth satellites were launched into orbit;

- the removal of reserves of materiel-technical means from the permanent depots at BRACHT (22 kilometers north of MONCHEN-GLADBACH), GERMERSHEIM (25 kilometers north of KARLSRUHE), HELLENDORF (28 kilometers southeast of LUXEMBURG) was observed;

- in the Federal Republic of Germany, Belgium, the Netherlands, and Denmark, a strict limit has been set on POL.


Meteorological, physical-geographical, and astronomical conditions are the actual ones.


Be prepared to report to the directing body of the exercise:

1. Measures for supporting the movement for commitment to battle of the troops of the First Front of the Polish Armed Forces, for organizing the replacement of their personnel and equipment losses in the course of the operation, and for organizing materiel-technical and medical support.
2. The arrangement for supporting the movement of the troops of the Fourth and Fifth Fronts through the territory of the Polish People's Republic.
3. Measures for protecting and maintaining transportation lines and for covering key installations on the territory of the country.

EXCERPT

From the Coordinated Plan of Cooperation

1. In conformity with the plan, moving through the territory of the Polish People's Republic to the theater of military operations are:

- the Fourth Front (Belorussian Military District) in the zone: on the right - SOKOLKA, MILAWA, INOWROCLAW, SZAMOTULY, KOSTRZYN; on the left - DUBIENKA, LIPSKO, KAMIENSK, JELENIA-GORA, ROMBARK, and concentrating in the area of MUHLROSE, BAUTZEN, JAROCIN (excluded);


- the Fifth Front (Carpathian Military District) in the zone: on the right - DUBIENKA, LIPSKO, KAMIENSK, BRZEG, JELENIA-GORA (excluding all points); on the left - the national boundary of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic with the Hungarian People's Republic, and concentrating on the territory of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic.

2. In the interests of providing for the movement of the troops of the fronts, the General Staff of the Polish Armed Forces is implementing the following measures:

a) Allocating agreed-upon routes for the movement of the troops of the fronts, making duplicate bridge crossings on the Vistula River in the areas of WLOCLAWEK, PLOCK, ZAKROCZYM, DEMLIN, PULAWY, SANDOMIERZ, TARNOBRZEG;

b) Organizing jointly with the Fourth and Fifth Fronts and deploying the road traffic control service and the control and communications system of this service on the march routes of the troops of the fronts;

c) Providing cover to the troops within the general system of the Air Defense of the Warsaw Pact Countries and in cooperation with the air defense forces and means of the advancing fronts. Here the main efforts are concentrated on covering the crossings of the Vistula and Oder Rivers;


d) Providing for the reception at the airfields in WROCLAW, KRZESINY, POZNAN, POWIDZ, GOSTYN, LASK, and SRODA of seven air regiments of the 30th Air Army of the Fourth Front (two regiments of MIG-23 aircraft; two, of MIG-21 aircraft; two, of SU-7BKL aircraft; and one, of YAK-28R and MIG-21R aircraft);

e) Allocating fuel for the troops of the Fourth and Fifth Fronts from the reserves of the Combined Command of the Warsaw Pact Countries, medical facilities of the Polish People's Republic, and rolling stock to the border transshipment areas in the amount specified in Attachment No. 4; and carrying out measures to prepare the railroads for massive troop movements;

f) Coordinating with the staffs of the Fourth and Fifth Fronts the subject of the mutual exchange of information about the parameters of nuclear bursts and the radiation and chemical contamination situation; and providing for radiation and chemical reconnaissance along the lines of the Vistula and Oder Rivers.

3. The antilanding defense of the seacoast, the security and maintenance of the transportation lines of the Polish People's Republic, the battle against enemy sabotage-reconnaissance groups and airborne landing forces, and the covering of the most important installations on the country's territory are being organized by the forces and means of the Polish Armed Forces.

4. Measures for organizing the replacement of the personnel and equipment losses of the troops of the First Front in the operation and their materiel-technical and medical support are being carried out in accordance with the plan of the General Staff of the Polish Armed Forces.

The escorting of reserve companies and cargoes through the territory of the German Democratic Republic to replace losses in personnel, combat equipment, and materiel suffered by troops of the First Front during combat actions is being done in coordination with the Main Staff of National People's Army of the German Democratic Republic.

5. By supplementary instructions, two Soviet Army fighter air regiments will be transferred and operationally subordinated to the Air Defense of the Polish People's Republic. They will be based at the airfields in BYDGOSZCZ and TOMASZOW MAZOWIECKI.

Backup bridge crossings with a load capacity of 60 tons are being prepared by the Soviet Army engineer troops across the Vistula River in areas five kilometers south of TCZEW, 10 kilometers north of GRUDZIADZ, and 15 kilometers west of TORUN, NIESZAWA, OLAWA.




