Re Nikola Abramchyk

On February 5, 1968, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) that Nikola Abramchyk, also known as Mikola Abramchek, President of the RADO (Council), Byelorussian Democratic Republic in Exile, who resides in the vicinity of Paris, France, recently arrived in the United States (US). His purpose is to contact the Byelorussian emigres in the US and Canada. He is currently in Canada, and will subsequently visit Detroit, Cleveland, Chicago and Washington, D. C. He will return to New York City about March 15 - 20, 1968.

This source believes that the subject will probably convene the RADO in New York City by March 25, 1968, as a great number of Byelorussian emigres reside in this vicinity. The RADO will be convened as part of the celebration of the 50th anniversary of the proclamation of independence of the Byelorussian Democratic Republic, March 25, 1918 - March 25, 1968.
