SUBJECT: DPD Airlift of AEDEPOT Agents in Wartime

REFERENCE: Memorandum from C/WPS to CSR dated 1 March 1962,

1. Reference is made to Memorandum of 1 March 1962, a copy of which you took back to your office after the CSR Staff Meeting on 9 March 1962.

2. ^{with} The specific reference to the suggestion made by C/WPS that SR Division place a requirement on DPD for preparation of a plan for pick-up of the DEPOT agents, and also the suggestion (made in paragraph 3 of reference) that SR, DPD, and the Office of Security develop procedures for notifying and assisting the movements of the DEPOT agents to designated pick-up points, I suggest that we defer until (WPS) returns from leave about April 1. I talked to Hal on this before he left, and he indicated that it would be desirable from his point of view as well as ours to defer until his return so that he may serve a "point of contact" role in getting together the various people whose interests are involved and also will be available to help in the actual development of the plans and requirements involved.

3. It is suggested that you and look this over in the meantime and give thought to the manner in which we can best express our requirements to be placed on DPD, and in turn, how we would go about effecting notification of agents, etc.

4. For your information, the following definitions have been provided by Col. Mangold:

DEFCON 2: This describes a situation where an attack looks possible although it is expected that adequate time will be available (probably at least a day and a half and maybe up to a week) to get ready.

DEFCON 1: This is a condition where hostilities are considered to be most imminent - where we can expect to relocate any time between one and thirty-six hours.
