1. Developments

a. By the time this report reaches Headquarters, a Headquarters case officer will probably have already conferred with AECASSOWARY-3, who was scheduled to arrive in PBPRIME on 5 September. It is expected that AECASSOWARY-3 provided a firsthand account of the Project reorganization carried out "in the field" so that little can be added from this end which is not already known. It is hoped the problem of financing his trip has been met without any unpleasantness and to his satisfaction. We, of course, also regret the misunderstanding caused by the cable error in DIR-28699 as regards financing AECASSOWARY-3's trip.

b. Aside from the Project reorganization carried out by AECASSOWARY-3, et.al., which, as mentioned above, should be explained in person by AECASSOWARY-3, nothing further of significance occurred in AERODYNAMIC during August.

OPERATIONAL MATTERS AND COMMENTS

1. AECASSOWARY 3 had made an error in the newspaper accountings for the fourth quarter of FY 1957, so the undersigned returned these accountings for correction. After explaining to AECASSOWARY 3 where he had erred, AECASSOWARY 3 made the necessary corrections.

2. During this meeting, the undersigned paid the safehouse rent (through AECASSOWARY 6) and also paid AECASSOWARY 6 his salary for July. Since Headquarters had not as yet approved the newspaper subsidy for August, the undersigned told AECASSOWARY 3 the August subsidy would probably be approved in a day or so, perhaps even later in the day, and if so, the money would be delivered to him. (NOTE: Approval was received later in the day and the money turned over accordingly.)

3. AECASSOWARY 3 reported that the consolidation of the two newspapers was nearly completed and that so far there have been no difficulties in this move. He said he still has not completed the preparation of the information requested in DIR-26185, but was working on it and would try to have it finished before he left for PBPRIME later in the month. The undersigned suggested that perhaps he (AECASSOWARY 3) might bring up the matter of personnel with Headquarters people when he is in PBPRIME, especially since he expected to discuss this with AECASSOWARY 2. AECASSOWARY 3 said he definitely would go over the entire problem of the newspapers, personnel, etc., with AECASSOWARY 2, but in the meantime, would try to turn something in here on this. Actually, AECASSOWARY 3 did not seem too disturbed by this personnel matter - perhaps there are no problems.

4. The next meeting is to be arranged by phone.

~~B. ~~Trifun~~ STUDYNSKY has gone off on a vacation to St. Remo in the French Riviera with his current heart-throb, Fraulein Antonia KLEIN, and an unidentified Bukovinian emigre lawyer. KLEIN is described as being Sudeten Deutsch and is employed with the Wirtschafts Ministerium (Prinz Regentenstrasse). She is rather hefty, blonde, wears glasses and was born circa 1917. She was Iva BISAHA's girlfriend before his defection to the USSR.~~

CONTACT REPORT - AECASSAWARY/3 - 22 August 1957

1. This meeting was for the purpose of finding out what AECASSAWARY/3's PBPRIME travel plans were and to offer him our aid in defraying travel costs. Regarding his travel, AECASSAWARY/3 said he had booked passage on an American-Holland Lines ship sailing from Rotterdam on 27 August and arriving in Hoboken on 5 September. He said he would probably stay in PBPRIME until late October at which time he would return to Europe via ship, not necessarily the same one he travelled to PBPRIME on.

2. On this topic, the undersigned told AECASSAWARY/3 approval had been received to pay his fare and travel expenses. Expecting AECASSAWARY/3 to receive this news with some enthusiasm, the undersigned was surprised to hear AECASSAWARY/3 say our help was not necessary as he had already paid for his ticket. When the undersigned said he would then reimburse him for the cost of the ticket, AECASSAWARY/3 said there seemed to be too much trouble involved. He then related the contents of a letter he had received from AECASSAWARY/2 in which AECASSAWARY/2 told AECASSAWARY/3 about being questioned several times by headquarters case officers with respect to why it was necessary for AECASSAWARY/3 to come to PBPRIME. AECASSAWARY/2 informed AECASSAWARY/3 that he had to provide some logical justification for the trip before our aid could be given and that finally, he convinced someone the trip was necessary. All this, said AECASSAWARY/3, was quite disturbing to him since he never asked for our aid in the first place.

3. The undersigned told AECASSAWARY/3 he regretted this unpleasantness and felt that it was probably due to some misunderstanding on the part of Washington. The undersigned even went so far as to tell AECASSAWARY/3 things like this were quite normal since whenever any money is involved, the "auditors" require adequate justification for any expenditure, etc., etc. To get on to another topic, the undersigned closed this discussion by telling AECASSAWARY/3 he (the undersigned) would advise Headquarters to reimburse him on his arrival there. AECASSAWARY/3's last words here were something to the effect "leave well enough alone."

4. After asking AECASSAWARY/3 to give the undersigned's greetings to AECASSAWARY/2, /4, and /15 and after reminding him (unnecessarily) to discuss the entire newspaper reorganization in PBPRIME, the undersigned bid him bon voyage and then left.
