SUBJECT is 30-32 years of age, small appearance, thin, medium height, dark hair. He is also a musician and plays at weddings. He is from the SANOK region in Poland, probably villages RICHYTSI or LANY.

SUBJECT is married and has little girl 3-4 years old. He has also his mother who lives with him. He owns his house at RAIDUZHNA Street No 5 or 8 in KOZELNYKY, a suburb within the greater Lviv. His house is new, built from cinderblocks (shlaky). Vis-a-vis his house is an old fashion well with a chain down bucket. *(The well is in the vicinity of the house)*

SUBJECT has a friend with whom he works. He is the son of the land lady at whose house SOURCE lived at RAIDUZHNA Street. The name of the landlady is FETSOVYCH, Varvara and the name of her son is fnu SHCHERBAK. The difference in ^{has/ been/} last names is not explained. Probably FETSOVYCH is married twice. The FETSOVYCH house and HINDA house are on opposite sides of the RAIDUZHNA Street, but SOURCE does not remember which number 5 or 8.

Manner of approach: Raiduzhna Street is a little farther away in the direction of Sakhiv. It is called the "old colony". *(STARA koloniya)* Going from down town one could use a trolley from Prospect Shevchenko which goes every five minutes (probably No. 6). This trolley goes to Velisipedni Zavod. When one gets out of the trolley at Velisipedni Z. he should continue in the direction in which trolley travels. (Trolley went as far as Velisipedni Zavod but it may now go to Betomni Zavod). When trolley goes to Betomni Zavod, he should go to Betomni Zavod, get off and continue walking in direction which trolley travelled, then turn in direction

which trolley travelled. Then walk along side ^{of} railroad tracks and ~~where~~

you arrive at corner of Perzenkivsky and Raiduzhna Street. Another method of approach is via bus from ^{HALYTSKIY} Bazaar. ^{Take} The bus marked "do Sikhova" and leave bus at ^{the} "fifth brick factory" (pyati tseholyaniy zavod). Then ~~go~~ take street which goes toward the rail tracks, cross the tracks and go to the old colony (Stara ~~K~~olonia).

This takes about 10 minutes from the bus and 15 to 20 minutes from the trolley.

The bus travels at $\frac{1}{2}$ hour intervals and cost (at that time) one ruble.

Shcherbak is very thin and tall. They arrive home from work about 6 p.m.

Almost all the people in the area are resettlers from beyond the Kherson line, from the Sanok region.
