<p>1. The information contained in reference was passed to the 7000th Support Wing on 2 April 1963, and they have provided the following reply:</p> <p>a. This organization traced Subject on 16 January 1962, and interest was terminated on 31 January 1963. Records reveal that Subject visited his sick aunt, unidentified, in Belgium in September 1961, on a twenty day visitor's pass. After visiting for a few days, he decided to go to Munich, and while there he requested political asylum from the German authorities. Subject resided with his uncle, fnu SAMOJLOW, in Munich-Ludwigsfeld prior to moving to his current residence; Seutstettnestrasse 11, Munich. He is physically handicapped, and as of 28 January 1963, he was unemployed.</p> <p>b. In an interview on 22 and 26 January 1963, Subject stated that he had visited the offices of the American Fund for Czechoslovakian Refugees, Rossartstrasse 9/111, Munich. The visit was in regard to emigration to Norway. There he talked to one Anna KAPILOVA, a former Czech who now lives in Norway, but makes infrequent visits to Munich. She has been helping Czech refugees settle in Norway for many years. Subject supposedly will emigrate to Norway about June 1963, and will work as a bookkeeper.</p> <p>2. The 7000th SW has advised that their files contain some additional details concerning acquaintances who are still in Czechoslovakia, and they have stated that this information will be made available upon request. They further state that there is no record of Subject receiving any correspondence from any of these people.</p>
