MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Soviet Exchange Student at University of Illinois
*FOMICHOV, Yuri (AKA: FOMICHEV)

1. The daughter of AECASSOWARY/2 (hereinafter referred to as Miss S) who is a student at the University of Illinois met Subject at the University in November 1962 through a friend of her's, Irene LANGE. (Irene LANGE: Born ca. 1938 in Latvia, naturalized U. S. citizen. LANGE's father was of German origin and served as a senior officer with the Latvian Army. He disappeared during or after WWII. LANGE's mother was Russian. Irene LANGE is working on her PhD in Marketing at the University of Illinois.)

2. Miss S met Subject again in December 1962 when she attended the International Student's Fair at the University of Illinois. She complimented Subject on the neat arrangement of the Soviet display of literature. This pleased him and knowing Miss S was of Ukrainian birth, he gave her a "Guide to Kiev" which he autographed.

3. Miss S again met Subject in March 1963 at a University student's gathering. This time Subject was in the company of Irene LANGE. Irene LANGE invited Miss S and Subject to supper in her home. During the visit in Irene Lange's home, Subject was more talkative than usual. He asked Miss S whether she was familiar with Maiboroda's Ruchnychok and they sang it together. During the evening he expressed his "opinion about the international situation" by stating that, "We are already in Cuba and will soon also be in Venezuela."

4. One evening in May 1963, Miss S again found herself in the company of Subject and Stephen LANGLEY (young American stage director who in 1956 visited Moscow). On that evening, Miss S exchanged addresses with Subject. On 6 June 1963, Miss S accidentally met Subject on the street near the University. Subject told her he was going to Chicago and from there would drive to New York where he would visit for a week before going to Washington, D.C. and on to Moscow. Subject asked for Miss S's address in New York. She didn't give it to him, giving the excuse that her parents recently moved and for him to check the directory when he got there.

5. Miss S gave the following information about Subject. Born ca. 1931-35. Russian. Married. Working on Doctorate in Animal Science. After his graduation in Animal Science from Moscow University, he did some research and had been assigned to a laboratory before his departure to the United States. Subject drinks wine but no beer. He played

chess almost every evening. Modest dresser. Likes music but has no good ear for it. Rather reserved when first meets someone but usually turns out to be a rather interesting conversationalist. About 5'9", slim, dark blue eyes, brown hair combed straight back.
