1. Subject was second to Director FEDORIACHENKO in the administration of the Kiev Ballet. He is Ukrainian, aged 30-35, 5'8, blond, somewhat red-haired, small squint eyes, married to a physician, has a small son. Subject is employed as inspector with the Ministry of Culture, Ukr SSR, Kiev. In Paris ^{he} was often seen in a blue Simca, 75 IT 306701 CD. Much of his time he also spent in company of DUBROVSKY of Paris. He also wanted to know whether Source knew DUBROVSKY.

Subject was asking usual "biographic questions", wanted to know details about Suchasnist. He behaved like a typical KGB officer.

Source met Subject almost every day. He used to greet Source with " Dear Friend, just don't talk too much about politics and bring less of your literature..." He was obviously unhappy about Source's access to the Ballet .

2. According to Subject the Ministry of Culture keeps all volumes of Suchasnist and he was reading the journal. Just before his departure for Paris he read the articles on Shevchenko-monument in Washington, D.C. and one by Kononenko.

3. Subject knows PIDSUKHA and said that the latter was telling widely in Kiev about his meetings with Ukrainian emigres in Canada.

4. In Subject's view Radio Liberty program was very bad though it was well heard in Kiev.

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5. According to Subject Prof George LUCKYI of Toronto, Canada should not have written ^{any} introduction to "Lehkosynia Dal" because the contents of the work speak for themselves.

6. KOSHELIVETS Ivan was described by Subject as a Hochstapler, his introduction to "Panorama..." was very bad and insulting.

7. Subject claimed to have been in Kazakhstan in 1957 and seen there Ukrainian villages dated back to 1907. The populace speaks Ukrainian and upholds Ukrainian traditions.

8. Subject was often seen in Paris in company of a representative of Moscow Ministry of Culture, an employee of "Inostrannaya Literatura" whose name began with "K".

Additional Notes on Subject by Dr Mytr^{of ch}

9. According to Mrs ZUKOWSKI when on 8 Jan 1965 she came to the hotel to pick up FEDORIACHENKO for the dinner party at her house, the latter after having looked under the lampshade, lifted the telephone receiver also, asked her whether Subject was also invited. Mrs ZUKOWSKI replied that not but she could always invite him if FEDORIACHENKO wanted to. The latter replied, "when he was not invited then better don't invite him now". He talked however to Subject when they bumped on each other in the lobby prior to FED'S departure for Zukowski's house.

10. Dr Mytr described Subject as an administrator (meaning KGB) of average intelligence, ~~rather~~ quite average in his profession, quite easy to be discovered and handled even for untrained people.

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
