

Canadian Citizens Reportedly Involved in KGB Activities

ACTION REQUIRED - REFERENCES

Ref: OCOW 5707, 25 February 1966 74-124-29/3 SR/CA

1. We have passed the information contained in referenced dispatch to SMABOVE and are awaiting their reply. From our local point of view we were particularly interested in the information concerning contact of MOTA and KOLASKA with Soviet officials here. The Soviets mentioned are identical with I.F. SHPEDKO the present Soviet Ambassador to Canada, <O.N. KHOMENKO , a KGB officer with emigre targets who returned to the USSR in late 1955; and V.I. ROMANYUK a GRU officer who returned to the USSR in the fall of 1964. > We have asked SMABOVE for further information on Soviet Embassy contacts with MOTA and KOLASKA and other Canadian Ukrainians; and would very much appreciate any additional information on the subject which you might get.

2. One point on which we may be queried by SMABOVE. According to OCOW 5534, of 22 October 1965, KOLASKA returned to Canada from the USSR in August 1965; and according to SMABOVE information on KOROTYCH contained in the attachment to OCOA 10432 dated 21 January 1966, KOROTYCH returned to the Soviet Union from Canada in May of the same year. Does this mean that the information which KOLASKA is alleged to have passed to KOROTYCH was probably passed in the Soviet Union and that the two knew each other in the USSR?

3. As far as the arrest of Ukrainian nationalists is concerned, we presume you have received the recent SMABOVE information on this subject which was contained in OTTA 3075 of 17 February 1966, and in the attachment to OCOA 10520 of 25 February 1966. We have received some additional information on the subject from SMABOVE which will be forwarded as an attachment to OCOA 10537 of 4 March 1966.


