1. According to reports by members of the delegation of Canadian Progressives, on arrival in Moscow, the delegation was referred to Kiev as the appropriate base for their complaints and discussions. In Kiev, the delegation was directed to 17 different administrative and governmental institutions. The appointments followed one another so closely there was no time for members of the delegation to discuss and consider among themselves points of issue. Their complaints about Russification and other problems in the Ukraine were treated with an air of frivolity, and it was implied that they were exaggerating the situation. The only interview of any length was the delegation's meeting with Petro Shelest, 1st Secretary of the CC CPU. He, however, merely lectured the members on the proper behaviour for members of the CPC. Although he suggested that they take more interest in international problems, he told them to avoid becoming involved in matters of no direct concern to them as members of the CPC. It became obvious to members of the delegation that their efforts to force any relaxations in discriminatory policies in the Ukraine were in vain.

2. Reportedly, the abortive results of the delegation's visit are being widely discussed at gatherings of the Progressive Party in Canada with general dismay and discouragement.
