1. In July 1970 the Centre d'Etudes Industrielles, Geneva, 4, Chemin de Conches, Switzerland will get a new Soviet student by the name MYKHAILEV, Stepan Borisovich. Last year they had a manager from a Sverdlovsk plant by the name VELIKOTSKIY, Aleksandr Nikolayevich, aged 34, Russian.

The Director of the CEI (Bohdan Havrylyshyn) continues to maintain ^{official} contact with GVISHIANI and his deputy ANANICHEV. The latter visited him already two or three times and he had both, private and official invitations from GVISHIANI and his colleagues to visit the Soviet Union.

According to our Source the Sovs are deeply interested in getting American know-how in education in management ^{moreover} without being compelled to have to do with Americans directly in this field.

According to ANANICHEV they planned within the next 8 years or so to establish in the Soviet Union about 250 schools for education in management.

Soviet visitors from Moscow and Kiev to the CEI are usually accompanied by a translator from Soviet Consulate by the name PERCHYK, Vadim, Ukrainian, aged 32(?), at one time studied in the States. Sometime also by another Ukrainian - UDOVENKO, Genagiy, aged 35.

2. Mid-Apr 1970 our Source in Frankfurt/Main, West Germany had an encounter with Prof. BORKOVSKYY, Viktor of Academy of Sciences, USSR, Moscow, specialist of East-Slavic syntax, aged about 70. 1945-1949 B. lectured at Lvov University and was quite familiar with Ukrainian affairs. B. was interested in some specialized literary stuff. The conversation was politically of little interest.
