<p>1. AECASSOWARY/29 contacted [ ] per Ref. A plan on 16 June. Due to a previous operational commitment, the undersigned was not able to meet with him on that date. [ ] substituted at the meeting and asked A/29 to survey with A/31 and A/34 any possible REDSKIN leads. In addition, A/29 was instructed to reaffirm with A/34 existing communications arrangements with [ ] (See OSSA-9779, 11 August 1960) since he, A/29, was now bowing out of the picture.</p> <p>2. At the scheduled meeting on 19 June, the undersigned passed along the information to A/29 contained in Ref. C. He stated he would comply and fully understood the contact instructions for his sojourn in Paris.</p> <p>3. A/29 passed on his re-debriefing report of Mrs. OKOLOP, based on the questions put forth in EGFW-12206. We are submitting the report without comment but wish to call to Headquarters attention the leads noted on Pages 7 and 8 of A/29's report.</p> <p>4. In addition to the report, A/29 passed on four recent letters and a photograph which Mrs. OKOLOP gave him on a loan basis. Copies are attached. [ ] is returning the originals via mail to A/34.</p> <p>5. A/29 reported that A/34 preferred not to maintain any frequent contacts (See Paragraph 1. above) with HUBARK. He pointed out that he was much too busy and could not afford the necessary time for clandestine activities. In view of A/34's position, this is understandable. A/34 is willing to help the cause <u>providing the AECASSOWARIES are aware of the activity.</u> In this regard A/29 states he had given A/34 a PBPRIME letter-drop with the AECASSOWARIES.</p> <p>6. It appears quite obvious from Paragraph 5. (above) that any REDSKIN leads which the AECASSOWARIES may uncover in Sweden will first come to PBPRIME. From our point of view, this is unsatisfactory for obvious reasons. It may be worthwhile to point out to the AECASSOWARIES in PBPRIME that any operational leads should be reported promptly to the accommodation address which A/34 has or better yet a Station contact should be made.</p> <p>7. Since the undersigned <sup>as a specialist</sup> is departing at the end of June, there will be no [ ] qualified to handle the remnants of the AERODYNAMIC project in Sweden.
