Subject was a representative of the Foreign Representation of the Supreme UKRAINIAN Liberation Council. Established a Bi-weekly Newspaper.

As per oral and written instructions from forwarded herewith are two copies of the newspaper subsidy agreement signed by Yurij von LOPATYNSKY. The agreement in three copies and a receipt for thirty thousand Deutsche Marks were signed by LOPATYNSKY on 12 December 1950. Neither LOPATYNSKY nor CASSOWARY 3 posed any objections to the terms of the agreement. One copy of the agreement will be retained in the MOB files for perusal by the signee on demand.

MEMORANDUM

POB UKRAINE OCC PUBLISHER Germany

TO: Yuri von LOPATYNSKI, authorized representative of the Foreign Representation of the Supreme Ukrainian Liberation Council, ZP UHVR.

- 1. A subsidy of 50,000 (fifty thousand) Deutsche Marks will be presented to you for the establishment in Germany of a newspaper to be unofficially controlled by the ZP UHVR.
- 2. This subsidy shall be used to cover the expenses of publishing and distributing a newspaper for the period of 4 (four) months. Initially, the newspaper will comprise 5000 (five thousand) copies and will be issued bi-weekly. Distribution will be in and outside of Germany.
- 3. In return for the subsidy, it is agreed that you will provide [] for his representative with the following:

A. A monthly financial accounting of costs broken down in the following manner:

I. Production

- Printing
- Paper
- Distribution
- Correspondence
- Printing of addresses
- Office supplies
- Office rent
- Light and Heat
- Telephone
- Photographs
- Foreign Press
- Books and miscellaneous

III. Monies collected from subscribers in various countries.

- B. A detailed monthly report on the popularity of the newspaper in various countries and among various political groups.
- B. A monthly critique to include suggestions for improving the form, content and distribution of the newspaper.
4. Further, it is agreed that [] or his representative shall to a limited degree have the function of consulting editor in that the publishers will seek his approval for all major articles and editorials before these articles and editorials go to press. Specifically, the editorial policy as regards [] country, unity in the emigration and the publication of intelligence information procured from the homeland must be made acceptable to [] or his representative. As regards the publication of intelligence information procured from the homeland, it is agreed that such information will not be published in the newspaper or any other publication if the printing of the information violates the security interests of [] country.
5. Further, newspaper space will be made available to [] or his representative for articles provided these are consistent with the overall policy of the ZP UHVR. Some articles presented for publication will be already written and will require only translation. Others will be outlined briefly and a native editor of the ZP UHVR will write the article himself.
6. Profits accrued from the sale of the newspaper shall be the property of the ZP UHVR so long as these profits are used for purposes which are not contrary to the interests of [] his representatives or [] country. In general, it is agreed, however, that the profits shall be employed on projects which directly or indirectly benefit the interests of [] and his representatives.
7. Finally, it is agreed that the ZP UHVR shall not make the sense or subject of the publishing agreement or the subsidy public in any way.
8. If the newspaper is a success and is deemed worthwhile by [] and/or his representative, requests for the approval of additional monthly subsidies will be made.

9. The sum of 30,000 (thirty thousand) Deutsche Marks will be delivered to the ZP UHVR at the time its representative signs the above agreement. The remaining 20,000 (twenty thousand) Deutsche Marks will be delivered to the ZP UHVR one month from the date of the appearance of the first issue of the projected newspaper.
