On 3 Feb 55, Theodor ALBERT, net operator for the ICG in SALZBURG, Austria, contacted a Frau HEHNLER (phonetic) advising her that she was in MUNICH. He inquired about a card from the Inhabitants Registration Office which was supposed to be in HEHNLER's possession. HEHNLER stated that she had the card and that ALBERT was to go to the office and bring his residence permit with him. ALBERT replied that he would go there immediately and would come to HEHNLER's residence that afternoon.

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SUBJECT: ALBERT, Theodor

Born on 9 October 1922 in PLANEGG near HEINICH, ALBERT resided in 1954 at SALZBURG, Austria, Neufangasse 3/1. SUBJECT is married to Maria ALBERT nee FESE, born on 19 June 1925 in KIRCHDRAUF, CSR. (P-2)

From 1928 to 1938 ALBERT attended school in BUDAPEST. In 1938 SUBJECT moved to BELGRADE where he attended high school and graduated in 1941. ALBERT then studied law in BRATISLAVA and VIENNA, but discontinued his studies in VIENNA in 1945 due to financial difficulties. In early 1945 SUBJECT had his family moved to BAD GASTEIN, Austria, where they remained until January 1946, when ALBERT returned to VIENNA to study at the Hochschule fuer Wirthschaftswissenschaften. While engaged in these studies SUBJECT worked for a translation agency located at VIENNA VIII, Pfaffgasse 32, where he resided at the time. During the same time, ALBERT also wrote newspaper articles on southeastern European affairs and became the VIENNA representative of the British publication, Trade and Industry. In 1948 SUBJECT obtained employment with the Red White Red (Rot-Weiss-Rot) radio station in VIENNA, acting as an editor and speaker in the Serbo-Croatian language for the Voice of America. ALBERT quit his job with the Rot-Weiss-Rot station in August or September 1949 when he obtained employment with the UNION publishing firm. In January 1950 SUBJECT founded the press agency, Interreport, located at VIENNA IX, Mochtensteinstrasse 3, together with Ernst Peter RINDL, alias Georg UDL, born on 13 July 1915, and Dr. Herbert ROEMIG. Interreport collected information, mostly of an industrial and economic nature, on southeastern countries and then distributed the information to various publications and agencies. In January 1952 ALBERT left Interreport, allegedly because RINDL, a former Austrian Communist Party propaganda agent in VIENNA, had founded communist cells in England and Canada during World War II, and because Armand FELLNER, who later became a partner in the firm, turned out to be an intelligence agent for another country, and used the publication as a cover for his intelligence activities. Subsequently SUBJECT moved to HALLWANG and to SALZBURG, where, in 1953, he reportedly was engaged in writing newspaper articles concerning southeastern Europe and the Middle East for various newspapers and publications in Germany and Austria. ALBERT allegedly became active in the intelligence field in March 1952, when he met Dr. Wilhelm HOETTL, and was recruited by HOETTL for an information-gathering agency. (C-3) A contradiction exists here in that SUBJECT claimed that he had been put in touch with HOETTL by Georg UDL, the cover name of RINDL, with whom ALBERT allegedly had broken off association because of RINDL's KPO connections. (B-2)

In approximately 1952 ALBERT allegedly had contact with the KPOs in VIENNA through one Heinz SIEBERT, an editor of the Oesterreichischer Beobachter, the National Liga publication in VIENNA. SUBJECT's connection with RINDL has already been noted. (C-3) In April 1953 ALBERT's wife, Maria ALBERT nee FESE, is reported to have stated that if she had remained in the CSR, she would have had a Doctorate in the field of Pharmaceutics, and would have been first assistant at the Galenic Institute of the Medical School of the University of Salzburg, and a confident of the KP. As it was, Maria ALBERT felt that she had missed all these chances. (B-2)

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
