TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This is to advise that Gunter d'Alquen was brought from Germany to the United States, leaving on September 3, 1948 and arriving on September 5, 1948. Mr. d'Alquen was brought to the United States by the Department of Justice as a witness on behalf of the Government of the United States in the treason prosecution of Martin James Monti, now waiting trial. Pending further developments in this case, Mr. d'Alquen is being permitted to return to his home in Germany on furlough, but his presence as a witness will again be required in the United States during the months of January, February and March, 1949.

Throughout the recent investigation of this case by representatives of the Department of Justice in Germany, its presentation to a Federal grand jury in the Eastern Judicial District of New York, and the preparation now being made for its trial, Mr. d'Alquen has been fully cooperative in his attitude and has rendered the United States Government most valuable assistance. He has enabled representatives of the Department of Justice to contact numerous prospective witnesses whom we could not have located without his assistance, and he has, furthermore, been largely instrumental in obtaining the voluntary cooperation of certain other essential witnesses in these proceedings.

During Mr. d'Alquen's recent sojourn in the United States he has been allowed complete freedom of movement, excepting for such times as it was required for him to be in attendance as a witness. He has at all times been most circumspect and gentlemanly in his behavior and has proved himself to be fully worthy of the confidence of myself and my associates.
