A meeting of the employees of the Consulate was scheduled for the home of MIODRAG MIHAJLOVIC on May 13, 1957. A meeting of the employees of the Consulate was scheduled for the home of MIODRAG MIHAJLOVIC on March 29, 1957. (SF T-3, 5/8; 3/28/57.)

It was stated that the number of visas granted for the first three months of 1957 had totalled 150 versus the 100 issued the year before. (SF T-3, 3/26/57.)

The Consulate was to participate in the International Trade and Travel Exhibit to be held at San Francisco, May 18 - 26, 1957. The Consulate was to furnish films and other items. (SF T-3, 4/5/57.)

THE ANDREW ARTUKOVICH MATTER:

In previous periods the efforts of the Consulate to secure the extradition of ANDREW ARTUKOVICH, former minister in the government of Pavelic, in the war years to stand trial for alleged "war crimes" have been set forth. This matter continued to receive attention during this period with a new attorney being appointed to replace RONALD WALKER, who had received a Federal appointment. The new man was named DANIELSON, and said to have been formerly an Assistant United States Attorney in Los Angeles. (SF T-3, 2/15/57.)

As of March 26, 1957, a hearing had been held in the case, at which time ANDREW ARTUKOVICH had denied doing what he had been accused of and he claimed that all the deeds had been done in the heat of war. (SF T-3, 3/26/57.)
