SLAVKO FRAS

During the last part of October, 1976, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised as follows: (U)


SLAVKO FRAS, Managing Editor of a Yugoslav newspaper "Delo", recently visited the Center for European Studies at Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts. While at the Center, he spoke to ANDREI MARKOVITS of the Political Science Department and JEROME KARABEL, a graduate student in Sociology. The discussion centered on the case of ANDRIJA ARTUKOVIC, an alleged war criminal that the Yugoslav government is trying to have extradited from the United States back to Yugoslavia. FRAS tried his best to influence KARABEL (supra) for a concerted action in having ARTUKOVIC extradited. KARABEL noted that he has previously contacted people in the news media regarding ARTUKOVIC and has received information that ARTUKOVIC may be extradited to West Germany. FRAS countered this remark by stating that, "We can get him there." (S)

Asset also advised that KAM... has a girlfriend from Zagreb, Yugoslavia, who is a student at Harvard University. Her last name is PANKOVIC and her father is a medical doctor and a director of a large hospital in Zagreb, Yugoslavia. (S)

MARKOVITS speaks German fluently and can carry on a very intelligent discussion. (S)

FRAS took a picture of both MARKOVITS and KARABEL standing in front of Harvard University. (S)
