SUBJECT: Nazi War Crimes Investigation

REFERENCE: OGC 82-11357, dated 22 December 1982

1. An intensive search of the files and indices of the Directorate of Operations was conducted in order to surface any information concerning:

A. Activities by the individuals in reference between 1933 and 1945 which would indicate membership in the Nazi Party, SS, Waffen SS or quisling governments established under German occupation; and

B. Immigration by these individuals to the United States and naturalization. (S)

2. The following represents information surfaced in response to your request. (U)

3. John AVDZEJ aka: Jan or Ivan AWDZIEJ

OG/EIB/NRS surfaced 201-065496 on Jan AWDZIEJ, born on 27 February 1905 at Stolpce, Poland. In 1939 AWDZIEJ went from Poland to Germany where he worked in the White Russian Committee. He was transferred to Warsaw, Poland in 1940 together with the committee. After the outbreak of Russian-German hostilities he was transferred in 1942 to the SD Paranowicze, Poland and was later made director of the Nieswicz district. His first act was to remove all Poles from administrative positions. Later in 1942, AWDZIEJ compiled a list of 120 allegedly politically dangerous Poles and submitted the list to the SD in Paranowicze. He took an active part in the execution of these people. AWDZIEJ

is further alleged to have taken an active role in the execution of several thousand Jews in Poland. He reportedly came to Western Germany with retreating German units. AWDZIEJ was allegedly planning to emigrate to the United States in May 1950. On 26 November 1951, visa applicant Alexander AWDZIEJ listed a brother, John AWDZIEJ, (who may be Jan AWDZIEJ), on his personal history statement as residing in Canfield, New Jersey. (S)

4. Azda Byakkayevich BOLDYREV

OG/EIB/NRS surfaced on one Alex BOLDIREW who was born 2 December 1920 in Astrakhan, USSR. In January 1943, BOLDIREW entered the Vlassov army (Russians who fought for the Germans). He surrendered to the British in Austria, in May 1945. BOLDIREW was kept in POW camps in Rimini, Bari and Naples until April 1948, at which time he was released by the British. (S)

5. There was no record on the remaining individuals in reference. (U)

6. According to information provided this Directorate by DDA/IPD, there is no indication that the individuals in reference have ever been Subjects of an FOIA/PA request. (U)
