1. What is your religion? Do you believe in God? Were you baptized and confirmed? How often in the year do you usually go to church?
2. What are you most afraid of: serious diseases, being an invalid, poverty, contempt of or from your fellow-men, the Cheka, or death?
3. Do you have enemies? Why, and where are they now?
4. What persons abroad know or suspect something about your present activities, and how much?
5. Describe the year of the Communist occupation (from June 17 1940):
  - a. What did you feel when the Communists moved in?
  - b. An exact description of your jobs and pay.
  - b. Documentation (what did the certificates look like and how were they used; of what advantage were they outside of work).
  - d. To what organizations did you belong during this time; what did they do, and what did the organization's certificates look like.
  - e. How often were the work certificates and the organization certificates changed or prolonged.
