FORD is to pay Subject a visit on orders from SKURIN (qv), but FORD does not know what the Russians want to find out, as SKURIN did not give source the briefing he had promised.

Ford met Subject 6 January at home in Berlin/Zehlendorf, Subject said that she was working at OMGUS, Econ, Div, Industry Branch, Public Utilities Section, where she was a secretary for a Mr. DE FOREST, whose rank was equivalent to Brig. Gen. Her duties included translation of documents into English, French, and German. Office was responsible for all public utilities in AMZON with offices in the key cities. Ford's estimate of Subject is not particularly favorable, first impression that she is rather sharp, a "cat", and morally probably quite loose.

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THE Third Army Interr. Center at Freising from which she was released in Septemb. At that time she was released pursuant to a project drafted by us, joining the Red Cross in Bavaria, but the project failed, and so the present one in Berlin was formulated and subject transferred there.

Control Factors: One of the rare Germans who understands and is sympathetic towards Democracy. Subject is an automatic arrest.
Husband: Lt. Colonel Gerhard Beetz, General Staff officer: Was released from American PW camp c. November 1946 & given discharge papers. Promptly arrested again as a "security threat" held in the civilian internment camp at Ludwigsburg in Wuerttemberg. The camp is run by Germans under American supervision.

Security: Has been approved by vetting.

Agent Capabilities: Subject was placed in the Economics Division of OMGUS for the "Sitting Duck" project which failed to materialize. FORD has now thoroughly aroused the interest of SKURIN in subject. ~~SKURIN~~ now directing the FORD - SKURIN - GAMBIT Operation.

BERLIN OPNS REPORT FOR FEBRUARY, dtd 1 March 47:

Continues along parallel lines with the FORD project, with which it is closely coordinated.

Progress: Failed to yield, thru no fault of her own, the hoped for result. Project is still active and further developments may be expected. (LTS-2007, 4-5-47)

"Our project for Subj is designed to open yet another source of ALCATRAX information. It will utilize channels offered by a prominent Berlin SPD newspaper with excellent Russian Zone SED coverage. This project is unlikely to pay off in the near future. Paradoxically one of the main stumbling blocks we envisage is Subj's exceptional intelligence and efficiency. She is soon rendered indispensable to her over/employers at the expense of her productivity in clandestine information fields."

Case Officer:

1. Information Objectives: Alcatraz-type material.

2. Specific Targets: CAMLET, Ost-Büro of Telegraf, German officials and civilians coming from the Russian Zone.

4. Proposed method of control and contact: Ideological control. Agent procured her release from OMGUS and obtained her present position at the Telegraf through us. Knows that her appearance at home in Weimar in the Russian Zone would lead to immediate arrest by the Russians. Is contacted at her home in the US Sector of Berlin by Case officer.

5. Proposed cover: Cover is legitimate employment by newspaper Telegraf as editorial assistant. In January 1948 will head her own research department at the Telegraf. Knows Case officer is intelligence officer. Is probably aware the organization has some relations with OSS, because of continuity of control since August 1945.

7. Other major factors: This operation is related to project CAMLET. Agent is married, but husband lives in Darmstadt, in the US Zone. Brother and mother live in Weimar.

Information objectives:

- a. Identity of Russian penetration agents in OMGUS
- b. Development as cut-out

Operational targets to achieve such objectives:

- a. Penetration attempts of RIS into OMGUS
- b. German press circles

Method of control and contact:

- a. Ideological control. Agent obtained her position at OMGUS through us. Husband in detention in Amzon, and agent's appearance at home in Weimar would lead to immediate arrest by Russians.
- b. Is contacted at her home in American Sector of Berlin by Case Officer.

Cover is full time job as secretary-translator at OMGUS.

Present plans call for more active role as high-class cut-out, to newspaper Telegraf and other circles.

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
