Name trace is hereby requested on the persons mentioned below in whom ZIPPER has an operational interest:

1. SPEER, Klara; born 3 May 1894 in SCHWEDT; husband former member of German army, deceased 1945; lives SCHWEDT, Oderstrasse 20. Ca. 165 cms. tall, of stocky build, has blue eyes and white hair.

2. RUSCH, Herbert; born 1909 in ELBING, East Prussia; married with two children; living Berlin-Wilmersdorf, Wexstrasse 33. Prior to 1933 held for a short time a position in a bank; assigned 1933 to Reichs Labor Service (RAD) where his last rank corresponded to that of 1st Lt. (Feldmeister). Accepted in 1950 a job as bookkeeper in a socialized plant (VEB) in East Berlin. Subject, fearing arrest for having made disparaging remarks about Sovzone politics, fled to West Berlin in 1952. He has been unemployed since that time and has been assisted financially by his mother. RUSCH is ca. 175 cms. tall, of heavy build, and has blue eyes.

3. BIEDERBICK, Andreas; born 12 March 1909 in Neuss, Rheinland; married with two children; lives Duesseldorf, Friedrichstrasse 87. Subject graduated from the Gymnasium and attended the University (place not given), where he studied philology and physical culture and passed his final examinations as Dr. phil. in 1936. He joined in 1935 the SD (SS Security Service) of the HFSS (Reichs leadership of SS troops) West DUESSELDORF as cultural adviser. In December 1936, BIEDERBICK was transferred to the SD-H Office Berlin (Scientific Research & Archives section, working on a history of political events following 1918). Was arrested by the Americans and handed over to the Belgians who held him until March 1948. After his release, subject earned his living as an assistant bookkeeper and as office worker. Partly unemployed between December 1951 and October 1952; since October 1953 subject has been working as independent translator for various firms, among them being the Duesseldorf branch of the Publishing House C.W. Leske, Darmstadt. Subject is ca. 191 cms. tall, of slender build and has blue eyes.
