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Andreas HINDERBYCK:

In June 1945 SUBJECT, alias Andre BACH, was arrested by the US Forces in the area occupied by the Fourth Waffen SS Panzer Korps near EBERFING, Bavaria, after complaints had been made by the Waffen SS officers that SUBJECT's presence in the area was undesirable. (B-2) SUBJECT stated that he entered the National Socialist Student's Union in 1930 while he was a student at the University of BONN. In 1931 he joined the Allgemeine SS and the NSDAP. In 1935 while he was writing his thesis for his PHD, SUBJECT was approached by the Chief of the SD in DUESSELDORF, who offered him a position in the RSHA in BERLIN. SUBJECT accepted and commenced work for Abteilung I-32 in December 1936. During WW II SUBJECT attained the rank of Sturmabfuhrer in the Allgemeine SS, Major in the SD and Abteilungsfuehrer in the RSHA. From June 1940 until the autumn of 1943 he served in Abt. XII of the SD in France. In the autumn of 1943 he was transferred to the SD in BRUSSELS to work as Referent of Abt. III-G. In September 1944 his office was forced to close operations and he was transferred to SALZBURG, Austria. He was in charge of Section III-G and was given the job of creating Section III-G (Gesellschaftsnachrichten Dienst.) In May 1945 SUBJECT managed to be accepted by the Fourth Waffen SS Panzer Korps because he said that he feared being treated as a partisan if he were to be captured as a "stray" soldier. (F-6) SUBJECT was reported to be arrogant and a firm believer in the aims of the NSDAP. (B-3) In January 1946 it was reported that the Belgium government had made a request for extradition of SUBJECT. (B-2) (CONFIDENTIAL) No additional information available.

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
