

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) records at Hartford, Conn., disclosed subject, bearing Passport No. 4459094, arrived Bridgeport, Conn., as motor-man aboard S.S. "M/T BILL" on 8/15/57, inspected and admitted for shore leave; subject missed vessel when same left Bridgeport and thereafter voluntarily surrendered himself to INS, New York City, on 8/19/57. Records at Collector of Customs Office, Bridgeport, Conn., reflect SEGUISMUNDE BOROWSKI, Passport No. 4459094, was member of crew aboard SS "M/T BILL" which docked at Bridgeport on 8/15/57; crew list did not contain the name ZYGUMUNT BORKOWSKI. No record of subject at hotels and subject not known at Polish clubs in Bridgeport, Conn.

AT HARTFORD, CONNECTICUT

On October 30, 1957, ROBERT J. WYNNE, Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), Hartford, Connecticut, advised that the only information he had pertaining to the subject was that appearing on the Crew Manifest of the SS "M/T BILL" which docked at Bridgeport, Connecticut, on August 15, 1957.

WYNNE related that at that time the subject was inspected and admitted for shore leave. The subject thereafter missed the ship when same left Bridgeport and the subject went to New York City and surrendered himself to INS on August 19, 1957.

The record reflects that the subject joined the ship at Buenos Aires, date not specified, that his job was that of a motor-man, his nationality Polish, and his passport bore the number 4459094.

The following investigation was conducted by SA SHERRILL W. LAW.

AT BRIDGEPORT, CONNECTICUT

On October 30, 1957, Mr. JACK EVANS, Deputy Collector of Customs, Marine Division, U. S. Post Office, advised his records reflect the Norwegian Motor Ship "BILL" (#A 12704) arrived at Bridgeport on August 15, 1957, with a cargo of fuel oil consigned to Buckley Brothers, Inc. He stated this cargo originated at Curacao, Netherland Antilles, and this ship was cleared to leave Bridgeport on August 16, 1957, for Curacao, however, it could have departed any time within 48 hours after August 16, 1957. He continued that the crew list filed by the ship's master, GEORG MOLSTAD, reflected the name of one SEGUISMUNDE BOROWSKI, a Polish National, passport # 4459094, who shipped on at Buenos Aires, Argentina, and according to the clearance papers filed by the Master, BOROWSKI was indicated as one of the crewmen who would depart with the ship. EVANS stated that the crew list filed for this ship did not contain the name ZYGMUNT BORKOWSKI.
