1. Agent submitted no written reports.
2. Agent reported orally: that he did not have the complete proposal concerning the fighting group in the North due to the lack of one bit of information which will be delivered this day. He will, however, turn in a completed report tomorrow afternoon, July 8.

3. Case Officer instructed Agent:

a. Case Officer and Agent prepared an itinerary for July travel. The itinerary is as follows: 7 and 8 July, Frankfurt; 9 and 10 July, Esalingen; to collect names from a contact; 11 through 17 July, spotting in the area between Nurnberg and Kassel; 18 and 19 July, Frankfurt to Berlin; 20th, return to Frankfurt; 25, 26, 27 July, Munich, making a report of the month's travel to that point; 28 July to 5 August in Bremen, Hamburg, Luneburg, Kiel, Hannover, and Braunschweig; 6 August, Wiesbaden for monthly meeting.

b. Case Officer instructed Agent that the emergency point at which Case Officer could be reached would be at the Frankfurt railroad station Post Office, under the name of Olaf Swenson. Case Officer stated that he would check this on as many Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays as possible.

c. Agent stated in reply to a question concerning Klein that he must speak to him personally because of the fear that Klein has over the past sloppy security investigation.

d. Agent was informed that he must change his dwelling in Munich. He states, however, that his wife would like to be located in Munich because of its obvious advantages. He states also that his wife will be in Germany when she receives her Swedish citizenship. He states that his lease is up in September in Munich, but

that he would like to continue to live in that city.

e. Case Officer instructed Agent that there was no exact destination for Geyger who has not yet finished her schooling. Agent states that Geyger would like to continue her education and would rather be located in a University area if possible.

f. Case Officer instructed very carefully on what he was to do in Berlin concerning the spotting and contacting of persons in that crucial area. Agent was told to concentrate as much as possible on people from the East Zone.

g. Case Officer went over point by point the June accounting showing Agent his mistakes and demanding a clear, more concise and expert manner of accounting for the month of July. Agent was further encouraged to make a daily expense sheet and attach it to the completed monthly accounting.

4. Case Officer gave Agent nothing.

5. Special remarks: Agent reports that his car, while parked, was run into by a truck which did not stop and, consequently, the Volks Wagen, official car, will need some repairs which will be done in Frankfurt. Agent states, however, that his insurance should cover the cost of repairing. Case Officer instructed Agent to turn in an explanation of this accident.

6. Next meeting: July 8, 1952, Cafe Lang, Frankfurt, 1500 Hours.
