Traces on Dr. Ernst BRUECKNER

20 October 1954

The following are all unlikely traces on fnu BRUECKNER, but are included for the record as they might pertain to relatives of Dr. Ernst.

German Prisoner:

1. BRUECKNER, fnu — German: reported to be Leiter Abt IV Sipo & SD Lyons; said to have succeeded in Dec 43 a certain WELTI who had been killed at Macon.
2. BRUECKNER, fnu — German: Sipo & SD The Hague in 1943 (Dutch Desk has no traces), where he was reported to be employed as "Sachbearbeiter" at Binnenhof 4; interrogated suspects at this address.

SHAFF Cards:

3. BRUECKNER, fnu — Apl. Krim. Asst.; member of Amt IV Eins....Stapo Keeln (1944)
4. BRUECKNER, alias STAHL - Abwehr agent (1944)
5. BRUECKNER, fnu — was HITLER's personal adjutant.

OSS Report:

6. Dr. fnu BRUECKNER — SS Untersturmfuehrer; worked in Referat III C I of RSHA, Berlin, in 1945. Height: tall; hair: blond; build: heavy; face: wears moustache (rpt dated 12 Nov 45)

7. An Oberpoliseirat BRUECKNER is mentioned as the CO of the Bereitschaft in Pinnow.

8. Report re Communists in the French Zone of Germany. On a trip to Baden Baden met a Commandant REHARD in General KOENIG's office. After carefully checking O's papers, REHARD mentioned knowing (fnu) BRUECKNER of the Nordwest Deutscher Rundfunk, a friend of his from the resistance period in France.
