<p>EQBA 56970, 4 December 1961.</p> <p>1. We apologize for the delay in answering reference. In reviewing our file on UJNUTLET we were somewhat puzzled by an earlier description of the KGB case officer which is at odds with the one provided in reference. Please see EQBA 36747, 8 September 1958, in which Heinz bears the last name MAISKY and is described as being born in 1926, as opposed to 1910. Other discrepancies concern the hair, hands and the presence or absence of distinguishing characteristics, specifically a wart on the right cheek. Our UJNUTLET file stops short in July 1959. Perhaps later correspondence corrected these discrepancies. Would you please inform us. In the meantime (for KUBARK only) here are possible traces on the name MAISKY, which were not sent to you in 1958, and on KGB/CE officers of Heinz' general physical type.</p> <p>2. [] reports dated in June 1957, June 1958, July 1959 and September 1960 describe a GI. GLUSHAKOV, born about 1919, ca 172 cms. tall, thickset, strong to stout build, brown wavy hair combed back, full face, one gold or silver tooth in lower middle jaw, well dressed in Soviet clothing, spoke rather good German, married, wife's initials are T.T., presumably a resident of Kharkov, Karlshorst residence Koenigswinterstrasse 25. In August 1960 GLUSHAKOV had furniture ordered for shipment to Kharkov which was delivered by the HO under the name MAISKY. He told source that the furniture was for a friend; however, source had the impression that this was a lie. [] might possibly remember GLUSHAKOV because of this incident, plus the fact that he saw him for four consecutive years, and might be able to make an identification, positively or negatively, of Heinz' photo.</p> <p>3. During the four years' reporting period GLUSHAKOV was observed in several different automobiles associated with the KGB. Of these, one possibly is identical with an operational vehicle used by SHCHUKIN and LENA in UJDROLLERY-1500, (1 a black BMW IB 49-03. [] reported GLUSHAKOV in a black BMW with license either IA or IB 49-03 in June 1958. (Note(1): Heinz MAISKY used the same safe house in Karlshorst in the UJDROLLERY-1500 case--Koenigskerallee 46.)</p> <p>4. Koenigswinterstrasse 25 ties into a variety of KGB cases either as a safe house or as the location of operational telephone numbers. The only CE case identifiable with it is SMOTH's Horst EITNER case, through telephone number 50 25 63, given to EITNER as the home telephone of "Werner". We cannot, however, find any resemblance between Heinz (Or GLUSHAKOV) and the case officers in this case.</p>

5. "Felix" in the LENA case bears some resemblance to Heinz as described in BOMA 36747, particularly in respect to the hair tending to fall in the face and thickset build.

6. The case officer "Karl IVANOV" in WJDROLLERY 1201 fairly well fits the description of Heinz provided in reference. Note that while he gave the agent political EKI on Bonn he also gave him an emergency telephone number 50 28 19, which has appeared consistently since 1954 in KOB operations against Western intelligence services, primarily the British, but in one case UPSWING: "Kurt" gave Wolfgang PRIESENUTH this number in 1954 for reporting on Franz NEUGEBAUER, UPSWING: agent who was later kidnapped by the SMARR brothers. If UPSWING has not already noted the resemblance between "Karl" and "Heinz"--and if it is indeed a valid one in view of the conflicting descriptions perhaps they could show Heinz' photo to WJDROLLERY-1201. We have, however, no idea what the present status of this case is or whether this suggestion is at all practical.

7. We have, of course compared Heinz' photo with our KOB photo morgue and have re-run traces on the operational information given in BOMA 36747, with no positive results.
