

CONTACT REPORT

PROJECT: CADROIT

PRESENT: CARBOHYDRATE and [] TIME AND DATE: 1730-1730 6 April 1954

PLACE: CARBOHYDRATE's Apartment

1. The first matter discussed was that of a new DPA for a CADROIT co-worker in the East Berlin VP. CARBOHYDRATE was instructed to tell the man when he returned the next time, that the Ausweis will not probably be ready before the middle of May and that he should make no further effort to visit W. Berlin until he has the Ausweis. CARBOHYDRATE will arrange that the co-worker's wife will come to West Berlin on or about 20 May to receive the identity card. (Note: The personal data for this Ausweis has been forwarded to MKTPORZ through [])

2. CARBOHYDRATE raised the question of identifying the Institut für Sozialfürsorge, Steglitz, Altmarkstrasse 26, since a CADROIT visitor, Lilli Becker has received a request to go to this place and there is a feeling that it might be a cover for an intelligence opn. (Note: A request for this identification has been made.)

3. CARBOHYDRATE submitted a report concerning the SSD Tsuenbrietzen (which has been forwarded to CASTABIA/BOB).

4. [] recently approached CARBOHYDRATE with a story (from a Mitarbeiter) concerning activities of the FDJ in the vicinity of Klein Macknow. Allegedly six trucks filled with FDJers were observed driving at an accelerated rate up to the border into West Berlin, and just prior to hitting the barricade, the brakes would be applied and the trucks would swing off parallel to the border. The M/A felt that they might be practicing what might later be an operation to drive into West Berlin, seize documents and persons at a target like CADROIT and then return quickly to Eastern Germany. [] stated to CARBOHYDRATE that even though the story was somewhat fantastic, it did bring up a point worthy of study and that was the consolidation of the Linastrasse and Lindenthalerallee buildings, specifically, releasing the latter and constructing a barracks

adjoining the Limastrasse building. [] had made a rough estimate that the barracks would be paid for in approximately two years at the rate of rental which would be saved by releasing the Lindenthaler address. The consolidation would improve security and would ease some of the administrative problems connected with maintaining the two buildings. A barracks costs approximately DMW 20,000 (DMW 15,000 for the building and the remainder for necessary improvements such as lighting, partitions, safeguards, etc) CARBOHYDRATE was instructed to discuss the matter of the barracks with Fröhlich and determine its feasibility.

5. CARBOHYDRATE raised the question of how to inform co-workers of the discontinuation of letter drops, particularly if the letter drop has been dropped because of possible compromise. After discussing the matter, C. was advised by the undersigned to institute a system whereby each co-worker will be informed of such discontinuation by means of an innocuous letter containing a key phrase. The receipt of such a letter will indicate to the co-worker that he is not to write to the address formerly used by him and will not write until he has had the opportunity to come to West Berlin and receive a new address.

6. CARBOHYDRATE brought a copy of a co-worker declaration sheet which is to be signed by all CADROIT co-workers to indicate that they have no connection with other organizations. (Note: This form was initiated by [] following a long discussion of the subject between himself and the undersigned.)

7. To explore the possibility of obtaining a closer working relationship between CARBOHYDRATE and [] with more mutual respect in their joint relationship, the undersigned brought up the matter of joint meetings between the undersigned, [] and C. CARBOHYDRATE looked upon the suggestion with considerable favor and the undersigned stated that he would give the matter serious consideration. (Note: If subsequent discussions with Ladell also indicate acceptance of the suggestion in principle, it is contemplated that such meetings will be held approximately once or twice each month)

8. CARBOHYDRATE was questioned concerning his activities on behalf of the CASTABIA program and he indicated that, by moving up the time of his daily telephone call to the CASTABIA debriefing office, he had been able to effect a more acceptable time schedule with the person/whom he must coordinate. CARBOHYDRATE also reported that several of the persons which had been sent by him over to the CASTABIA establishment had returned remarking that their debriefing process had been completed. C. reported that the persons who had previously been showing up weekly at CADROIT from the (S) operation had not made any recent appearance.
