

CADROIT/CARBOHYDRATE CONTACT REPORT

28 Jan 55

Date, Time, and Place of Meeting: 27 Jan, 1900-2230, C's Apt.

Present: a. CARBOHYDRATE b. []

1. Due to illness of CARBOHYDRATE and trips by [], this was the first meeting since 18 Jan. [] had come prepared to give close scrutiny to the Grosskopf matter, having a list of written questions in hand. This proved unnecessary, however, since C raised the matter on his own initiative. C reported that in answer to his query to Hansen, the latter had denied any knowledge of G. (It will be recalled ~~that~~ that earlier che ks had shown no trace in CADROIT visitor or MA cards.) He noted again, however, that Hansen had earlier come to C on his own initiative to report that an East Zone contact had been turned over to him by van den Berg had been forcibly recruited by the SFS. The name of this contact, however, had not been Grosskopf. [] requested full written report of the incident with name of the east zoner, etc. (COMMENT: The story fits the Grosskopf story exactly as it is told by the LfV ~~man~~ in all respects except the name.). [] also noted that the van den Berg/Grosskopf matter had been ~~discussed~~ discussed between [] and Henard, and that a discrepancy in names had not then become apparent. It was agreed that C will ~~discuss~~ discuss the whole matter with Henard, pool all available info, and report to []

2. CARBOHYDRATE delivered:

- a. Fragebogen on E. S., who will be the new head of the press section. Salary will be DM 1100 (as opposed to approx 1500 for the Neue Zeitung).
- b. NAV file on Annemarie T., to be reproduced and returned.
- c. Results on 17 written name t aces earlier requested. For [] and other requesters.
- d. File on W. Von B., as earlier requested.
- e. Copies of two letters, ~~two~~ one of which will go to Frl. Liebig's brother-in-law and the other to the SFS H.A.V (responsible for action against N. Berlin groups). Purpose of the exercise is to convince the SFS to leave the ~~best~~ brother-in-law alone; Frl. L. is not defectable. Frl. L had requested that the letters not be sent until 24 Jan in the hope that the SFS would by then have stopped contacting the brother-in-law, thereby making the letters unnecessary. (Pepin had earlier approved the idea of sending letters if necessary).
- f. Report by Krebs to the effect that he had been visited by ~~a~~ Th. from the former's DOR village. Th had been told by an innkeeper who had been told by the mayor that the latter had been requested by the SFS to find some way to have Krebs' sick father moved from a hospital in Wittstock to one in East Berlin. The SFS hope was that if the father-in-law is in East Berlin, either Krebs or his wife will go to East Berlin for a visit. The mayor ~~had~~ fended off the SFS request, stating that he had no believable reason for the transfer.

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g. Report by son of Dr. Erben who fled to West Berlin after forcible recruitment by S&S with Dr. Erben as his target. The son, a student, will resettle here.

h. Info reports as earlier requested on Karl. P. and Hans G. For [] and then to ODOPAL.

i. Short report on KVP Bautzsch.

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j. File on the CADROIT MA 33 year old typewriter secretary who has been offered a job by the SFS to work in Normannenstr., including name and complete personalia. Contacted CADROIT in Sept. 52, has been MA since Jan 53. Currently being handled by Wels, whom she trusts. C stated the following as the persons who know that she is a CADROIT MA and has received the SFS job offer:

- Madell
- Ohlsen
- Wels
- Carbohydrate

The following are persons who could conceivably know that she is a CADROIT MA:

the above four persons plus--

Prengel (former chief of press section, who has certainly forgotten her name, personalia, says C--she was then one of hundreds)

Von R., who keeps the MA cards (has a poor memory and ~~unreliable~~ no particular reason for noting MA's file info)

MA stated she had a girl friend who is "one hundred per cent reliable" who could act as a cut out. C and [] agreed, of course, that if the story turns out to be ~~xxxx~~ true, the MA could not continue to come to CADROIT and should, if possible, not visit W. Berlin. The first one quarter of one half year would be one of great SFS scrutiny when there should be no or a minimum of contact.

The MA telephoned Wels ~~xx~~ about two weeks ago from W. Berlin (her job currently allows her comparative freedom to visit W. Berlin) that the job had not yet jelled and that she would call again on 17/1/55. She has not yet contacted CADROIT again. File to go to CART for reproduction and study. The matter has already been discussed with Si.

3. When [] queried on present status of MA 100 (when had he come in last, when would he come in again, etc), C reported 100 had been turned over to Abt. V, since the matter could no longer be stalled. 100 had pressed for approx one year to have CADROIT get him a job w. the West police. When Urban stated this to be impossible, 100 pressed vigorously to speak with the police himself. This was when [] stopped the introduction to Wierich of Abt V pending KUBARK study of the file, assessment of potential (about four months ago.) 100 would not wait, however. He had refused to be introduced to ~~xxxx~~ another office when ~~xxxx~~ sounded out by C. He was then introduced to Abt V with the provision that CADROIT will get copies of all Fahndungsbuch and ~~xxxx~~ Post and Meldeweeseen rufe s which 100 supplies to the police. During this discussion, incidentally, it developed that for a period of time CADROIT was the only west Berlin source of the Fahndungsbuch. Organizations which at various times have been able to get it

include DTLINER, W. Berlin police, and CADROIT. As of March 54, both GGIS and Abt V had no sources of their own, looked to CADROIT to supply copies. When [] requested a copy of the book, C noted that the photographer is spending all of his time on material for the "Arlsruhe" trial now on priority basis. Could Pepin have it copied over a week and ? (The book is used hourly by CADROIT during week days) [] would look into this possibility. (Really [] wanted to see, in view of the fact that photographing will not be an easy job—whether it is necessary to reproduce all of the book, or just the last few month's additions. CART will be queried as to what parts of the book they now have.)

4 [] requested four written name traces.

5. The earlier reference to the Fahndungsbuch led to C's statement that of all CADROIT personnel, only two were noted in the book: Hansen and the photographer, H.K. (This is the VOPO book, not the SFS book, which is unavailable in the West). This had led to ~~speculation~~ speculation that H.K. might be working for the East; the SFS would therefore have had his name included in the book to throw suspicion away from him. Although this was very speculative, careful consideration had been given to H.K. The possibility that he was really working for the East seemed to have been destroyed, however, stated C, by the fact that he had called C ~~immediately~~ immediately upon noting the contents of the exposed roll of film which had accidentally been turned over to CADROIT earlier, rather than concealing the film or making a copy (which C stated K. had no time to do). ~~When [] asked~~ When [] asked whether K had realized what the contents of the film were, C replied in the affirmative. [] noted that he did not know what the contents of the film were (not desiring to be drawn into a discussion of the contents with C) but that he understood that ~~had~~ [] had returned the film to KUBARK. [] then changed the subject, not wanting to ~~give C any more info re the film that he already had.~~ ~~give C any more info re the film that he already had.~~ give C any more info re the film that he already had. (The fact that C knew of the film, having been approached with it by K., falls within the framework of the possibility which was considered at the time of the earlier investigation: that other persons within CADROIT had seen or heard of the film in addition to Bernard, Ladell, and K.)

6. Re the new house in L. Str. which CADROIT is to take over, C has run a security survey of action to be taken to insure security. There are not now enough policemen in the area (there used to be 2 days and 3 nights; there now are 1 day and 2 nights) C will arrange to get further coverage by the police when the new house is occupied.

7. [] had the feeling during this meeting that C had done a good job on a number of the items which were discussed, and took occasion to say that the security of CADROIT showed the benefits of having a man like C spending considerable time on it.

8. C has recovered from his bad cold, although he still has a little sinus trouble.
