

CADROIT/CARBOHYDRATE CONTACT REPORT

14 June 1955

Date, Time, and Place of Meeting: 14 June 55, 1145-1210, street near Rosenack

Present: a. CARBOHYDRATE b. []

1. This meeting had been arranged with ~~some~~ little advance notice to cover two points only. These were as follows:

a. CARBOHYDRATE was informed that a refugee named Alfred HEICHEL would visit CADROIT at 1400 14 June and ask for CARBO. CARBO was to deal with him. The refugee came from Dresden and was now seeking political recognition. He had been called to appear at CADROIT at 1430 originally. CARBO was to see that:

- CADROIT raised no objections to the refugee's securing recognition.
- * CADROIT gave a positive recommendation that the refugee secure recognition if at all possible.
- CADROIT should in all other respects do all possible to see that recognition is secured.

CARBO was informed that there were certain elements in the situation which might appear derogatory (man had fled in SED car, etc.). These were known. [] assured CARBO that the man was completely in order. CARBO to inform [] if anything out of the ordinary developed, or if it appeared that the refugee would not get recognition. For Sig. H.

* [] informed CARBO that Kaiser's wife had written him that he, Kaiser, had been subpoenaed to appear before the Amtsgericht Tiergarten sometime during the present week (precise day unknown) to answer for "WBeantennstigung". This no doubt was connected with the letter Kaiser had written to the Sozialamt Wilmersdorf threatening to go to the DDR and cooperate with the SFS if his application for acceleration of his pension payments was not granted. Without causing undue interest to be shown, CARBO was to:

- * Contact the wife of Kaiser to learn more details of the case, Discussion showed that CARBO agreed this was possible.
- Contact the police (Wierichauk was suggested) and possibly also the Sozialamt to learn more details.

The purpose of the exercise of course is to quash the action if possible. It was agreed that this would probably prove difficult at best, but final decision on what is possible and what is not possible was put off until further information had been assembled. CARBO to give this matter priority and report as soon as he has learned anything substantial (which official is pushing the action, etc.)

3. CARBO noted CADROIT had been visited by the sister and brother-in-law of the recently ~~executed~~ death-sentenced Inu KOCH. The brother-in-law is ZIPPER, wants to establish contact with ZIPPER in W. Berlin. Could [] aid in putting him in contact, if this were considered desirable? [] would study the matter and inform later if a search showed that any thing could be done, but no action to refer the brother-in-law could or should probably be taken in this case.
