

CADROIT CONTACT REPORT

15 June 1956

Date, Time, and Place of Meeting: 14 June 56, 1600-1700, CART D/A house

Present: a. [] [] [] b. CARBOHYDRATE

This was a normal CARBOHYDRATE meeting. After the amenities the following points were covered:

1. The CADROIT secretary, Frau MARTINI, has received a message from her brother that he will visit her next Saturday (16 June). Presumably he CARBO will attend the meeting. comes at MFS behest. / This MFS approach was earlier reported.
2. CARBO delivered written report on a recent visit to GERRICH by his brother at MFS behest. This MFS approach has also been reported earlier. GERRICH had failed to inform CARBO of the meeting, so that CARBO did not have chance to debrief the brother. GERRICH promises to draw CARBO into the next visit, however. Report is attached, along with report on earlier visit.
3. CARBO delivered written report on 8 June meeting with WOSTRACK. Little new took place. The MFS demanded more information, which CARBO refused pending performance of their earlier promise to release FUELLBORN. MFS again pressed the proposal to use FUELLBORN's father as the middleman. Report attached.
4. CARBO delivered basic personalia on a MA whom FROELICH would like to use as caller. For name trace.
5. [] [] laid on a requirement for the submission of Stimmungsberichte from the DSW before and during 17 June. Each Besirbsbeauftragter to submit a brief daily report to a central place, possibly LADELL. Negative as well as positive reports of unrest desired. LADELL to submit overall report at next meeting with him if possible. He to be informed soonest of any signs of extraordinary unrest. CARBO noted that there are no signs of unrest in the DSW to date which have come to his attention.
6. With the above out of the way, we turned to one of the main pieces of business for the day. [] [] briefed CARBOHYDRATE that CASTABIA was [] []

to be re-established. It would be located at the house where the present meeting took place. CADROIT was to send to this office per arrangement by telephone, visitors to CADROIT who fell into certain categories. These categories had been put on paper; a copy was given to GARBO for his retention. The most important category concerned persons who had been recruited under duress by either MFS or RIS. GARBO was familiar with the requirement, which had been discussed two days earlier with []. He noted that the latter had been very depressed after his meetings with the C/O's and had gone immediately to LAHELL to report the matter. LAHELL had called in GARBO and Ohlsen (who deals with most of the Spitzselverpflichtete who come to CADROIT requesting advice). There had then ensued a lengthy discussion of the requirement, pros and cons, risks involved to CADROIT security and good name, etc. As expected, LAHELL was opposed to the program in substance and directed GARBO and Ohlsen to comply with the requirement in a manner which would take the teeth out of it. GARBO summarized by saying that the result of LAHELL's instructions was that persons of the desired types would not be sent. In the discussion of individual categories LAHELL had always attached so many exceptions that the exceptions practically exhausted the category. (This was spelled out in detail when [] ticked off the categories noted in his list of persons to be sent to CASTABIA and GARBO summarized LAHELL's feelings/instructions on each category. Some of the relatively less important categories had not been discussed with LAHELL, since [] briefing had been less detailed than CARBONHEAT's.) It was agreed that the only thing to do was to take the matter up directly and concretely with LAHELL. GARBO confirmed []'s opinion that HEMARD's absence from the city would play little role in the matter; in a discussion with KUBARK officials HEMARD would probably agree, if pressed, to the establishment of the program. This would not, however, get the program underway. /The key was LAHELL, who was described by GARBO as being "massgebend" for this matter. After [] had to leave the meeting, [] repeated that the next step was discussion with LAHELL and that we wanted to take all factors into consideration which bear on the matter. []

7. The reason for LAHELL's reluctance to go along with mass CASTABIA referrals is almost certainly his belief that the Motaufnahme, police, LfV, BfV, and other German authorities will learn of the ~~mass~~ funneling program in short order from persons who, having gone through the funnel, later appear in the BHAV process as refugees or otherwise come in contact with the authorities. ~~LAHELL~~ He probably feels that it is a type of operation which must be run clandestinely in order to avoid serious embarrassment to CADROIT and damage to its name. ~~It~~ cannot long remain secret due to its very nature. LAHELL fears that he would have no answer to future questions by the police or LfV why CADROIT did not inform these authorities of specific ~~cases~~ which were referred to CASTABIA rather than the police or LfV, if these ~~cases~~ truly fall outside of CADROIT's purview. (CARBOHURATE/CADROIT received ~~reports~~ from the police when it was earlier referring persons to ~~LAHELL~~ ~~LAHELL~~ complaints made by persons who had been referred to ~~LAHELL~~ ~~LAHELL~~ ~~LAHELL~~ probably lies in some form of coordination of the program with the police, LfV, etc. RECOMMEND that either [] or [] discuss the matter with LAHELL, stressing all the elements of coordination, backstopping, etc., which can be mastered.
