After the meetings reported in Reference, (under alias) met CAFREIGHT/1 on 19 February for a downtown dinner. C/1 was happy to see him and chatted almost continuously about her new apartment and the prospects of her new job. C/1 claimed she had refused to sign the formal secrecy agreement merely out of feminine pique: she really had no reason for NOT signing, she said, but felt put out because she had not been properly "prepared" and had suddenly found herself confronted with having to sign such a document out of the blue. (We will reintroduce this matter at a propitious moment.) Likewise C/1 claimed--contrary to her earlier remarks reported in Reference--to be perfectly willing to attend functions, parties or such activity during her off-duty hours at our behest. C/1 also reported the IDENTITY/1 personnel manager as saying her new position in the sales department would require handling sensitive correspondence whose contents must not be divulged to any third party.</p> <p>2. On 24 February C/1 met with both [ ] and [ ] for dinner. After the meal [ ] paid C/1 for February, told her he would probably be unable to come to Munich very often in the future but that [ ] would see her regularly, and departed. private secretary; in addition C/1 still enjoys various other social contacts among IDENTITY/3. From these she gathered IDENTITY/2 was about to be replaced.)

3. The next [ ] C/1 meeting on 17 March was largely confined to conversation about C/1's anticipated move to IDENTITY/4. She was in excellent spirits and reported among other things that IDENTITY/2 had already been replaced. She looked forward to starting her new position with IDENTITY/1 on 6 April but also voiced some apprehension as to just what this new job might have to offer.

4. On 1 April [ ] surprised C/1 at her new quarters around noontime; finding her home, he paid her for March and took her to lunch, a fortuitous move as C/1 declared herself to be flat broke.

5. COMMENT: It remains, of course, to be seen how C/1 will perform once she is settled in her new job and what she may produce for us. Meanwhile we think [ ] rapport with her is good thus far, and therefore believe he should continue to handle and assess her. To our thinking the "tandem" concept mentioned in paragraph 8 of Reference should mean that C/1 is run out [ ] while requirements and any guidance necessary is to be supplied by [ ] and Headquarters.
