

Tanganyika-Zanzibar: Little has yet been done to reduce Communist influence in Zanzibar following its union with Tanganyika.

Communist sympathizers still control information media and hold most other key posts in Zanzibar. Former President Karume will be under strong pressure from his former Foreign Minister Babu and others to resist accepting Tanganyikans in these posts.

[In a conversation with the US chargé on 28 April, Karume appeared to be trying to convey the impression that union was his way of stopping the drift toward Communism, but that he does not intend to subordinate himself to Tanganyika. Karume appeared not to have given much thought to the practical aspects of union.]

[Tanganyikan Foreign Minister Kambona has told the US ambassador in Dar-es-Salaam that security problems are far from solved, and that custody of weapons remained a problem.]

Support for the union appears to be far from solid in Zanzibar, even within Karume's own Afro-Shirazi Party. Leaders of the party's youth league and the principal trade union are said to have privately protested to Karume, and to have had at least one secret meeting with Babu.

[redacted] Karume had to raise the threat of intervention by Kenya, Uganda, and the UK in order to get the union ratified. Even so, 10 of the 20 Revolutionary Council members present reportedly abstained.

Kenya: A group of 105 Kenyans departed from Nairobi by special plane last week to receive military training in Bulgaria, according to information received by the US Embassy in Nairobi. This is the third Kenyan contingent sent to Bulgaria in the past 19 months. It was selected by Kenya's pro-Communist minister of home affairs, Oginga Odinga, with the approval of Prime Minister Kenyatta.

Belgium - West Germany: Chancellor Erhard made a strong case for the multilateral nuclear force (MLF) when he talked to Prime Minister Lefevre in Brussels last week. He hit hard on the theme that if no progress is made on the MLF, a future generation of German political leaders might espouse a national German nuclear force. Lefevre made no commitment to work for a change in Belgium's negative attitude toward the project, but he was clearly impressed by what Erhard had to say.

Brazil-Cuba: The question of a diplomatic break with Cuba has been reduced to a matter of timing.

The Brazilian National Security Council, which is composed of the cabinet and chiefs of the armed forces, is said to be divided on whether to move now or to wait until after the next meeting of OAS foreign ministers, the date of which has not been set. President Castello Branco is expected to make a decision today.

Cuba: Delegations from all over the world are arriving in Havana to attend May Day celebrations that will feature a three-hour non-military parade climaxed by a Castro speech. Castro is likely to use the occasion to press his campaign against US "provocations" and violations of Cuban sovereignty which he launched two weeks ago.
